## of the Professional Development Program

ge of Law designed the Professional Development Program to help you build your professional identity and network to your legal education career. Each year you will be required to complete certain mandatory activities. Additionally, to lyou will be required to attend networking and skills events, complete probono awareness tasks, and participate in activities. Inside your designated reporting cycle folder will include the activity categories and numbers of activities exporting cycle. The Professional Development Program is a floor, not a ceiling; OPD encourages you participate in vities as your schedule allows.

#### rks

cycles are based on the number of credits you have earned at the end of the semester. For example, you must have all activities listed in the "0 - 30 Credits Reporting Cycle" between the time you start law school and the semester in your 30th credit. For the "31 - 60 Credit Reporting Cycle" complete all activities listed between the semester you credit and your 60th credit. And for the "61+ Credits Reporting Cycle" between the semester you earned your 61st cater that you graduate. For some students, cycles may overlap. You may begin working on the next reporting cycle on pleted the last one if your semester bridges the reporting cycle. I.e. you start a semester with 27 credits and end it u can finish the 0 - 30 reporting cycle, then start working on the 31 - 60 reporting cycle activities.

<u>r Activities</u>: Mandatory activities include class level specific programming required by the Office of Professional Deve etings will be announced in the OPD newsletter, emails sent by OPD staff, and/or on TLCN. <u>g and Skills Events:</u> These events are often sponsored or co-sponsored by the Office of Professional Development, a Bar Association. They are designed to help you build your networking skills. Events can take place virtually or in p wed).

<u>nal Exploration</u>: Professional exploration tasks will aid in determining your professional identity and long-term career the profession can be done on a large scale, by attending an in-person or virtual legal conference, for example. Or c ale, such as a one-on-one informational interview. It is your responsibility to find outside events related to your areas et up informational interviews, or arrange observation of a legal proceeding. OPD is happy to help in your search.

<u>Awareness Tasks</u>: Ohio, along with many other states, encourages pro bono work as part of a lawyer's professional and justice system. Therefore, these tasks are not only a resume builder, but they will help kick-start a commitment al duty as lawyers. The Ohio Supreme court states in the Preamble to the Ohio Rules of Professional Conduct: "...[anould devote professional time and resources and use civic influence to ensure equal access to our system of justice use of economic or social barrier cannot afford or secure legal counsel." It is your responsibility to find pro bono clinicate help, or find an attorney to work with or shadow. OPD is happy to help in your search but will not be responsible for in these opportunities. OPD may advertise pro bono projects and other opportunities via the newsletter or emails. So credit reporting cycle are not required to complete a Pro Bono Awareness Task. #### Description:
