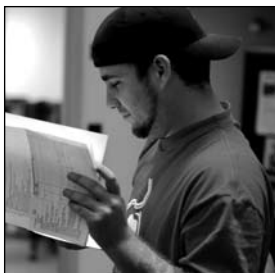


THE COLLEGE OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION UNDERGRADUATE EXPERIENCE



At The University of Toledo College of Business Administration, you earn more than a business degree – you earn a business experience. The college offers you academic programs and resources that stand out:

PROGRAMS OF STUDY

The College of Business Administration curriculum features a broad liberal arts background, a general core of business courses, and a specific area of career specialization. During your freshman and sophomore years, you will take English composition, mathematics, social sciences, humanities, natural sciences, and several basic business courses, which include career development components.

During your sophomore year, you will apply to the upper division of the program and begin your business core and major courses. You will select your area of specialization, or major, which you will complete throughout your junior and senior years.
