The College of Business Administration offers a general minor for students in non-business degree programs at The University of Toledo. This option is recommended for students who want to enhance their academic curricula with business-related course work.

With careful planning, students may be able to complete the requirements for a minor in business administration as part of the hours already required for their degree programs. Students should meet their college advisers to discuss how the minor requirements will fit into their plans of study.

Advisers in the College of Business Administration will also assist students in the planning of their minor course work. Nonetheless, it is the responsibility of each student to comply with all course prerequisites.

Students interested in more than one business minor or the MBA program should visit Student Services, in ST 1016. Only one minor course may "double count" in both business minors.

GENERAL BUSINESS MINOR FOR NON-BUSINESS STUDENTS

Program Requirements

A UT student enrolled in a baccalaureate college other than College of Business Administration may complete the minor in business by fulfilling the following requirements.

Prerequisites

A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.25 is required in the following prerequisite courses or their equivalents. A student who does not meet the minimum standards but has at least a cumulative 2.0 in the prerequisites will be reviewed by the College of Business Administration Admission Committee on an individual basis.

- * **Economics** 3-6
(ECON 1150 + 1200, MIME 2600, or equivalent)
- * **Mathematics** 3-6
(MATH 1260 + 1270, 1750 + 1760, 1850 or equivalent)
- * **Computing** 3
(BUAD 1020, CMPT 110, or equivalent or placement test at www.business.utoledo.edu)
- * **Statistics** 3
(MATH 2630, BUAD 2060, or equivalent)

Required Foundation Course (3 hrs)

Grade of C (2.00) or higher required in each course

- Financial Accounting**..... 3
(*BUAD 2040, ACTG 1040 or equivalent)

Additional Requirements (15 hrs)

Grade of C (2.00) or higher required in each course

1. A student must select **three** of the following eight courses, at least **one** of which must be at the 3000 level.

- Managerial Accounting** 3
(BUAD 2050, ACTG 1050 or equivalent)
- Introduction to Business**..... 3
(BUAD 1010, BMGT 1010 or equivalent)
- Application of Statistics in Business Decision Making**..... 3
(BUAD 2070)
- Global Environment of Business** 3
(BUAD 2080, BMGT 2110)
- Principles of Marketing**..... 3
(BUAD 3010)
- Principles of Manufacturing and Service Systems**..... 3
(BUAD 3020)
- Managerial and Behavioral Processes in Organizations**..... 3
(BUAD 3030)
- Principles of Financial Management** 3
(BUAD 3040)
- Information Technology Management**..... 3
(BUAD 3050)

2. A student must select **two** additional 3000+ level courses from those listed above, or select **two** courses at the 3000-4000 level from ACCT, BANS, BLAW, EBUS, EFSB, FINA, HURM, IBUS, INFS, MKTG, OPMT, ORGD, or PSLS to complete the additional requirements. All prerequisites for the courses chosen must be successfully fulfilled.
