Human resource professionals are employed in virtually every industry. About 3,800 specialists are self-employed, working as consultants to public and private employers.

Human Resource Management at UT

Human resource managers are needed in every size and type of organization. They help attract, develop and retain the people who make the organization successful. Human resource managers also work with team-building, problem-solving and interpersonal communication talents.

UT's human resource management program teaches students about a wide variety of HR issues – selection, training, recruitment, compensation, benefits, legal issues, employee relations and safety. The majority of UT graduates who take the Professional in Human Resources Certification Exam pass it on their first try, providing our graduates with a real competitive advantage in the marketplace.

Students are able to join the student chapter of the Society for Human Resource Management that introduces them to lifelong contacts in the field. Additionally, many HR practitioners speak in classes and to student groups. Finally, students can gain real-world experience through numerous internship opportunities that often lead to full-time positions. This lets students work with accomplished professionals in the human resource field while earning college credit and money.

What to expect when you graduate

Most graduates begin working as a human resource generalist whereby they complete multiple HR tasks. Others work as HR specialists and focus on one area, such as recruitment, compensation or benefits. Finally, some graduates have developed a human resource department for a smaller firm from scratch!
