- ⇒ During campus visits, talk to students to see the climate of the campus.
- ⇒ Always use professional email and voicemail on your cellular phones (no ring back tones.)

Mitch's Housewarming/Halloween Party

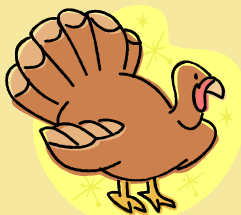
