The Judith Herb College of Education at The University of Toledo is seeking a tenured or tenure-track professor (open rank) for the Educational Administration Program in the Department of Educational Foundations and Leadership. We are seeking a creative and energetic professional to guide the development and implementation of innovative graduate programs grounded in the learning paradigm, which emphasizes a learner-centered, inquiry-based, experiential approach to the education of leaders. This approach is grounded in the philosophy of The Judith Herb College of Education, “Individuals at the center of their own learning within a rich intellectual environment characterized by choice.” The Educational Administration Program is comprised of an on-campus master’s program, emphasizing the education of Principals, and a doctoral program, emphasizing the education of Superintendents.

Required Qualifications: Candidates must possess earned doctorates in Educational Administration or a related discipline. The candidates must have an interest in developing and leading graduate programs in Educational Administration based upon the learning paradigm. The area of specialization within the field of educational administration is open.

Desired Qualifications: Ideal candidates will possess successful graduate level university teaching experience, including thesis and dissertation advisement, administration experience at the level of principal and/or superintendent, an active research agenda connected to schools and professional practice, a knowledge of multicultural and international perspectives, and team building, interpersonal, communication, and leadership skills.
