(A) Policy statement

The university recognizes—a students who haves earned high academic achievement. Baccalaureate students graduate with scholastic distinction on the basis of their overall higher education (overall) grade point average (GPA)UT GPA. A student's overall higher education UT grade point average GPA includes all course work taken at all regionally accredited postsecondary institutions of higher education, including the University of Toledo.—The higher education grade point average and it is unadjusted by the GPA Recalculation policy and/or the Academic Forgiveness policy. The higher education UT GPA will be used for purposes of determining eligibility for University, collegiate, departmental or professional honors and other recognition based upon the student's total-undergraduate academic performance as documented on the student's official transcript.—The higher education GPA is not indicated on the student's University of Toledo official transcript.

These averages and the citation they merit on the student's degree are as follows: 3.3, cum laude; 3.6, magna cum laude; 3.9, summa cum laude. Students must have taken 80 percent of their course work on the regular grading system, minus any credits earned in courses where the student has no choice in receiving a P/NC grade, to qualify for honors.

Students graduating with an associatee's degree will receive a scholastic distinction of "high scholarship" if their overall GPA is \$\alpha\$-3.3 or higher.

For tTransfer students, should note that the University of Toledo will include all college course work taken at all institutions of higher education will be usedfor in the calculation to determine if whether a student will is eligible to graduate with honors. All college coursework taken is computed in determining eligibility for graduation with honors, although no student will be awarded a level of honors above that indicated by the Uuniversity of Toledo-cumulative GPA.

Note: The University of Toledo requires a minimum of 30 semester hours of standard letter-graded courses from UToledo in order to qualify for graduation with honors.

(1) President's list

Each term, except including summer, full-time students (12 or more quality hours, graded A through F) earning a 4.0 GPA are selected for recognition by being named to the president's list. Because of the co-opprograms, full time students in the college of engineering will be eligible for the president's list during the summer term.

(2) Dean's list

Each term, except including including summer, full-time students (12 or more quality hours, graded_A through F) earning a 3.5 or above GPA are selected for recognition by being named to the dean's list. Because of the co-op programs, full-time students in the college of engineering will be eligible for the dean's list during the summer term.

(3) Dean's recognition list

The dean's recognition list is used to recognize part-time students for academic excellence. This recognition will occur in the summer for the previous academic year's performance. For this distinction a student must:

- (a) Be enrolled for both semesters of an academic year and complete a total of nine to 22 hours graded A through F between the two semesters;
- (b) Be a part-time student for the academic year; and
- (c) Earn a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better for each semester.

(B) Purpose of policy

The purpose of this policy is to recognize undergraduate students with high academic achievement.

(C) Scope

This policy applies to all undergraduate students. Each college may publish detailed implementation strategies specific to that college.

(D) Procedure

Review and calculation of a student's higher education grade point average is done at the end of each term, including summer for college of engineering students. Students are notified of such recognition in writing, which and the recognition is transcripted as part of the student's official record.
