### Professional Studies Major Proposal

In keeping with The University of Toledo's mission to improve the human condition, the College of Adult and Lifelong Learning is developing a Professional Studies major which will expand opportunities for degree completion among transfer and adult students and those with Associate degrees. This program will allow for nimble and responsive curriculum design, while maintaining the academic rigor necessary for quality, 21st Century education. Required classes will be flexibly scheduled (evening, weekend, modular, etc.), incorporating learner-centered models of curriculum development and delivery. The Professional Studies major will provide the University with another mechanism to offer career relevant, unique programs of study tailored to individual student needs.

#### The BA/BS in Professional Studies will:

- Increase degree completion opportunities for transfer students, especially those with associate degrees that are not articulated to existing majors
- Take advantage of a new and growing market of adult learners with significant (preferably 60+) earned hours who wish to return for degree completion and recareering
- Develop market-driven offerings in accelerated, customized delivery formats incorporating cutting-edge use of relevant technologies and instructional design
- Allow for the development of concentrated, specific areas of expertise with recognition of such on the academic transcript
- Utilize a full range of Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) opportunities such as credit by exam, CLEP and standardized testing, and portfolio development.
- Incorporate open source opportunities as an option for course completion
- Deliver curriculum such that cost of textbooks, fees, etc. are kept as low as possible

- Provide seamless, standardized options for degree completion, collaborating with other colleges to incorporate minors and concentrations thus allowing the other colleges to reap benefits of expanded FTE's.
- Help to meet Dr. Jacob's directive to offer high-quality 3 + 1 programs and adult focused curriculum delivered in a format that meets the needs of working adults.
- Further the AASCB mandate to have increased enrollments in COBI classes by non-COBI students and the presidential mandate to work collaboratively and forger partnerships among colleges, schools and programs
- Adhere to the newly established "Quality Standards for Accelerated Programs" adopted by the Commission for Accelerated Programs (CAP) and the Council for Adult and Experiential Learning (CAEL) and embraced by HLC and other accrediting bodies.
- Provide a range of academic and student support services (i.e. advising/coaching, tutoring, academic skills enhancement, orientation, career and life planning, financial planning, etc.) utilizing both high tech and high touch formats

### Entrance/Program Requirements:

- ✓ An earned Associate degree, or 60 semester-hours of transferable coursework and completion of the Ohio Transfer Module with a cumulative 2.0 grade-point average
- ✓ A minimum of 30 hours must be completed at the 3000-4000 level prior to graduation
- ✓ 120 semester-hours are required for graduation
- ✓ An approved minimum 18 semester-hour Concentration or Minor must be completed as part of the program
- ✓ Demonstrated computer proficiency, an Introduction to Professional Studies class and a Senior Capstone class are required of all students
- ✓ UT general education and core competencies must be met in transfer or at UT prior to graduation
- ✓ A minimum of 30 semester-hours of residency are required to fulfill graduation requirements

### Professional Studies Program Policies

### Admission Requirements

Earned Associate degree, or completion of 60 semester-hours and the Ohio Transfer Module

A 2.0 cumulative g.p.a. is required for admission

#### **Academic Policies**

A minimum of 120 semester hours is required for graduation.

40 semester-hours at the 3000-4000 level must be completed prior to graduation.

A minimum of 30 semester hours must be completed in the Professional Studies major at UT.

Core competencies not met in transfer must be completed prior to graduation from the Professional Studies degree.

A cumulative 2.0 g.p.a., along with a 2.0 g.p.a. in the UT core competencies and major, is required for graduation.

Students may be absent from UT for a period of six semesters (summer not included) without a change in major/program requirements.

Students in the Professional Studies major must complete 2 natural science classes (same or different departments). A laboratory class is not required.

Students in the Professional Studies program who qualify for Academic Forgiveness may elect to have credit removed for all grades of C- or below, or they may opt to remove credit for all grades of F and have the remaining coursework at the level of D- to C- continue to be calculated in the cumulative g.p.a. and meet degree requirements, where applicable.

All classes taken at UT that count toward the Professional Studies major must be taken for a letter grade, unless they are offered solely on a Pass/No Credit basis.
