### Comments/Notes:

Two changes are proposed to the existing program requirements (as per the Graduate Catalog for Psychology, page 16) for the Clinical Psychology Program.

One change is with respect to the Core Content Courses. Present program requirements indicate that 4 of the 5 courses listed as "Core Content Courses" are required. It is proposed that this requirement be changed such that all 5 courses are required.

The second proposed change is with respect to the number of credit hours required for elective courses. Present program requirements indicate that 4 credit hours of electives are required. It is proposed that this requirement be changed such that 3 hours of elective are required.

These two proposed changes would result in a change in the minimum number of credit hours for completion from 92 hours to 94 hours.

These changes have been highlighted in the "proposed degree requirements" document.

**Rationale:**

The Clinical Psychology Program at the University of Toledo is accredited by the American Psychological Association (APA). As an accredited program, our program is required to fulfill the standards of accreditation as set forth by the APA in order to maintain our accredited status. One training requirement of accredited programs pertains to broad and general preparation in psychology. Specifically, our doctoral program is required, for the purposes of accreditation, to demonstrate that our graduates have been trained in and can demonstrate competence in the following areas of psychology: biological aspects of behavior, cognitive and affective aspects of behavior, social aspects of behavior, history and systems of psychology, psychological measurement, individual differences, research methodology, techniques of data analysis, and human development. To provide this training and to demonstrate that our graduates have demonstrated competency in each of these areas, coursework in all 5 of the “core content courses” is required. Present program requirements stipulate that only 4 of the 5 courses under this heading are required, which is not consistent with program requirements for accreditation; as such, we are proposing to change this requirement to 5 courses.

With respect to the number of elective hours required, present requirements stipulate that 4 credit hours of elective are required. However, each of the courses suggested to fulfill this requirement is a 3-credit hour course. As such, we propose to change the credit hours required for the elective requirement to 3.

Making both of these changes will result in a loss of 1 credit hour and a gain of 3 credit hours, for an overall net gain of 2 credit hours, making the minimum number of credit hours required for the completion of this degree 94.
