Call to Order, Roll Call, and Approval of Minutes

The meeting was called to order and the roll called. The Minutes of the Graduate Council meeting of September 8, 2020 were approved.

Executive Reports

Report of the Executive Committee of the Graduate Council

- COVID Team Update
 Remote work agreement ongoing with discussions for spring semester 2021. There is testing availability before students go home at the end of the semester, November 19 & 20, 10 am 6pm in Rocket Hall parking lot. Expect to see announcements. Numbers are good.
- Meeting with Provost

GC Chair and Vice Chair, Wendy Cochrane and David Giovannucci met with the Provost. Items discussed.

Budget

We expressed concern over moving toward RCM budget model. COGS does not generate funding, and may be seen as auxiliary. We reinforced that we are at a standstill in terms of re-appointing a COGS Associate Dean and bringing COGS staff back to full. That means the interim COGS Dean is taking on additional responsibility.

President' Strategic Committees
 There was agreement that there was poor communication and that creation of committees
 occurred quickly. There are about 65 items in the strategic plan.

Whether intended or not, they do support shared governance. The October 23rd UT News featured an article about key initiates (will share link). In speaking with Diane Miller, she mentioned that they are in process of organizing committees and will be sending out invitations. I spoke with Diane Miller about names Graduate Council sent forward. Six of the eight committees being populated at this time have reps from GC who will be asked to serve. These committees will work hard and quickly. Other individuals may be resources. Strategic Enroll comm is focused on UG, don't know degree grad fac could populate.

<u>Report of the Vice Provost for Graduate Affairs and Dean of the College of Graduate Studies</u> Dr. Barry Scheuermann, Interim Vice Provost for Graduate Affairs and Interim Dean of the College of Graduate Studies provided the following updates:

- Search for the Permanent Dean
 No updates available at this time.
- COVID-19 Update
 - Our numbers continue to be very good compared to many institutions and communities around us. The task force and the students are to be congratulated for their compliance with the preventative practices that are in place.
 - The university is partnering with Toledo-Lucas County Health Department to extended testing to both students and the surrounding community on November 19th and 20th from 10:00 to 6:00 in the Rocket Hall Parking lot.
- Proposed Changes to Student Visas (summary from presentation at GC 10-20-2020)
 - During our last GC meeting, Tracey Hidalgo provide a summary of proposal that would impact International Students studying in the U.S.
 - Under the Department of Homeland Security proposal, F-1 visas for students and J-1 visas for researchers, scholars, and other exchange roles will be given a strict four-year timeline, regardless of program or purpose.
 - The administration proposed a new rule that would prevent students from certain countries from staying in the U.S. for more than two years, likely preventing them from completing four-year degrees.
 - Currently, these visa-holders can stay in the country for the duration of their programs.
 - Comment period has closed; there were many submissions in response to the proposed changes.
- Curriculum (CIM System)
 - An updated help guide has been uploaded to the Provost's website for entering new proposals and modifications and the process for suspending admissions into a program <u>https://www.utoledo.edu/offices/provost/curriculumtracking/.</u>

- Spring Registration
 - Spring registration opened on October 22, 2020
 - Tuition is due by Friday, June 8, 2021
 - Late payment fee will be assessed on January 11, 2021
 - Graduate students who are planning on graduating during the Spring semester will be required to register for a minimum of one credit hour
 - There is no"0" credit hour option due to State requirements

 - Proposals are due on November 30th

Research and Sponsored Programs Update

Dr. Frank Calzonetti, Vice President of Research provided the following updates:

- Policies
 - Research Council policy 3364-70-03
 Expected to go to Senior Leadership Team next week. Minor changes.
 - Research Integrity policy 3364-70-21
 Professor Llew Gibbons will give a report to GC at its meeting on November 17, 2020
 - Research Related Centers and Institutes policy 3364-70-16
 Looking at Centers and Institutes. Ability to provide a portion of central F&A: 70% central, 20% to department and 10% to college. Encouraging interdisciplinary collaboration, a small portion of central F&A. Received positive feedback.
- Foreign Gifts and Contracts

Department of Education is stepping up reporting of foreign gifts and contracts to universities. We have to report those above \$250,000 from single sources. If they come into different parts of university, we may not be capturing all of them.

• Special Election

Dean Scheuermann and Ms. Terri Hayes are meeting with International Services to review and verify regulations on work hours then plan to proceed with elections. We look forward to having three more e-board officers. Representatives are needed from the Colleges of Nursing, Natural Sciences and Mathematics, and Pharmacy. Please note that there may be more positions open as there are current representatives who have nominated themselves for the e-board.

• General Assembly Meeting October 20, 2020

Includes a faculty/student panel to discuss how to prepare for the academic job market. The panelists consisted of Dr. Patrick Lawrence of the Department of Geography and Planning (GEPL), Dr. Eileen Walsh of the College of Nursing, and Dr. Owusua Yamoah, a UT alumna of GEPL. Graduate Admission's Utilizing CAS Common Application System

Mr. Shawn Lowney, Associate Vice Provost for Enrollment Management Solutions, Liaison International presented a brief overview of CAS.

CAS is community recruitment tool. Unlike the individual application, we provide a wider net to engage and prospect students. You will have wider visibility for your programs. The link to your website will bring your prospects to your program, so there is no concern that interested applicants will have to find your site and search. In January, we will be coming out with another version of the smart link that will bring the applicant to the individual program that initially triggered them, if that is the way you set it up. CAS exposes your programs to those students who are applying to more than one program, so now you will have visibility to most graduate students applying to 2 to 2.25 programs per cycle. It provides an expanded applicant pool and a community ecosystem.

- Add custom requirements [Add Program] simply click '+'
- · Graduate applications go to central grad admissions
- · Can reach out and trigger an email campaign, no intermediary

Question and Answer Session:

- Q: Christina Fitzgerald inquired about training.
- A: Shawn Lowney responded yes adding that it is not overwhelming. It takes 120 days from setting up the application and completing workflows in small digestable pieces

Our team understands the education process.

Jim Anderson added that UToledo is using a team-centered process that includes IT. The transition in admission processing to CAS is not taken lightly. It is a core pillar of our institution. There are very great people at UToledo and Liaison working to make this successful. Everyone has a shared interest in our success.

Shawn Lowney pointed out that UToledo is fortunate and that many institutions do not have an enrollment operations teams. We had a kick-off call and gave them a few more weeks to gather information. That is very rare and helpful. Resources have been allocated to this. The process will not be hurried and he indicated he would stay involved during the process.

- A: Shawn Lowney indicated that he would send the presentation and his contact information will be included.

Guidance Document on Graduate Assistantships at UToledo

Dr. Barry Scheuermann reported that he is looking into the development of a guidance document as a resource on graduate assistantships so that all have the same terminology, guidelines and expectations, including students. Will address questions about holidays and vacations.

A policy on authorship is being developed under the guidance of the Provost's Office in response to the need for addressing questions that come up. Students should have some idea of what they can expect when they are working on a presentation, project or publication individually or as part of a group.

Resource items for inclusion should be sent to Dean Barry Scheuermann.

Chair Wendy Cochrane requested that input be sent in the next couple of weeks so that it can be moved to a working document.
