



Evidence Based Practice Project

Course Credit:

3 semester hours required. Offered as variable credit of 1 to 3 semester credits. This variable credit course may be offered over more than one term. The number of credit hours allocated per term will be determined in collaboration with the capstone advisor.

Acceptance into the DNP Program, Applied Research (NUR 8950/NURS 7040), and permission of the capstone advisor.

Catalog Description:

This course is a guided, independent project utilizing research to improve patient outcomes, health care delivery, or nursing practice.

Course Objectives:

1. Implement the evidence-based practice (EBP) study to improve nursing practice and/or health care delivery.

- a. Apply analytical methods to evaluate current practice or evaluate the introduction of a new evidence-based strategy/protocol.
 - b. Integrate evidence or bench-marking from national data bases in the development and or evaluation of this evidence-based practice study.
2. Defend the development, implementation and evaluation of the evidence-based practice study.

Content Outline:

The primary focus is guiding and facilitating students' EBP (capstone) projects as directed by their Project Chairs. The assigned course faculty will facilitate and assist students to implement their projects as directed by their project chairs and will meet periodically with the course faculty and students to discuss implementation of their EBP projects and the outcomes.

Teaching/Learning Strategies:

Small group discussion
 One-to-one mentoring
 Faculty student contracting

Evaluation Strategies:

1. Ongoing discussion and feedback will occur between students' Project Chairs and the course faculty during the term.
2. Students will implement an EBP study to improve nursing practice and/or health care delivery.
3. By the completion of the term, students will defend the development, implementation and evaluation of the EBP project.
