Re: Addendum to Course Approval for PSY 8940, APA Clinical Internship

Per the meeting this morning with Tammy Oelkrug (Academic Affairs), Lisa Hasselschwert (Rocket Solution Central), Amy Burns (Financial Aid), Terry Romer (Registrar), Greg Meyer (previous DCT), and Wesley Bullock (co-Associate DCT), the Department of Psychology is submitting additional information regarding the previously approved course PSY 8940, APA Clinical Internship

- In accordance with our accreditation requirements set by the American Psychological Association (APA), completion of PSY 8940 "APA Clinical Internship" is a mandatory requirement of our doctoral program.
- PSY 8940 is a year-long (3 semester), *full-time* supervised clinical training experience that must take place in an *APA accredited* predoctoral internship site. Students are matched to APA clinical internship sites through a national, competitively-based selection process (analogous to the national medical residency match).
- The required APA Clinical Internship takes place at a hospital or other clinical service setting that
  is not directly affiliated with the University of Toledo and often occurs at an out-of-state setting.
- Clinical Psychology students enrolled in PSY 8940 are only permitted to select internship sites from the APA accredited sites that are *full-time* internships.
- The assessment of the student's performance at their APA internship is completed by the faculty at the site (as required for all APA accredited internship sites). This assessment is communicated to the UT Director of Clinical Training who, in consultation with the student's UT

advisor and the clinical faculty, assigns and submits a grade (Credit/No Credit) at the end of each semester.

- Monitoring of the student's progress and final completion of the student's APA Internship is maintained by both the APA Internship site and by clinical psychology program in the Department of Psychology, as per APA accreditation requirements.
- Documentation maintained by the UT Department of Psychology clinical program to monitor progress and completion of the internship includes end-of-semester grades for each of the three semesters of PSY 8940 and certification letter of successful completion of the internship received from the director of the APA accredited internship training site and provided to the UT Director of Clinical Training.
