The purpose of this revision is to specify precisely the requirements for the Psychology PhD for the imminent updating of the graduate catalog. We have deleted 3 hours from the Core Courses and added 3 hours to the Concentration courses, but the total required hours remains 92. The terms in which each course is offered will vary. All courses are offered on campus except for internships.

Core Courses taken by all students: 44 hrs

Core Methods Courses = 12 credits

- *Students specializing in the clinical area must demonstrate broad exposure to the current body of knowledge and methods in <u>each</u> of these areas. If this is not done through these courses, it must be done (with a approval by the advisor and Director of Clinical Training) through a seminar course or other activity at the graduate level with sufficient breadth (e.g., a workshop at a professional conference, online course). This exposure must be documented as directed in the handbook provided to clinical students.
