THE GREAT LAKES PROVIDE DRINKING WATER TO OVER 40 MILLION PEOPLE














Key concerns about Waukesha's application

- 1. Waukesha wants to divert Great Lakes water for towns that don't need it and have not requested water
- 2. Diverting Great Lakes water should be a last resort
- 3. Waukesha **failed to demonstrate that it needs** Lake Michigan water
- 4. Waukesha has a **feasible alternative** to meet its water needs
- 5. Waukesha's **plan to return water** to the Great Lakes **could damage the Root River**

Regional Body reviews application, declares finding to Compact Council

The Regional Body's goal is to review applications within 90 days after they are received

Compact Council reviews application in light of Regional Body's findings The Compact Council's goal is to approve or deny application within 60 days

Approved? Application returns to DNR for final approval Rejected? Waukesha must revise its application and submit again.
