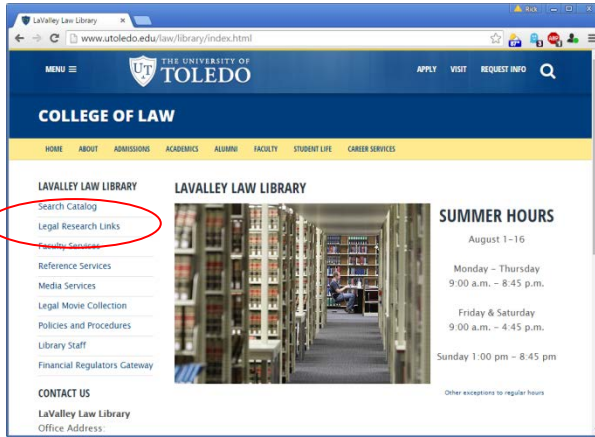


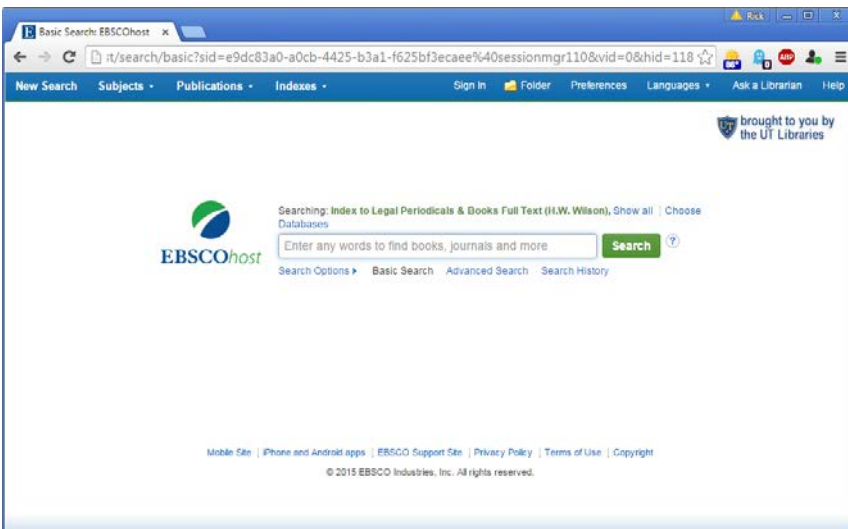
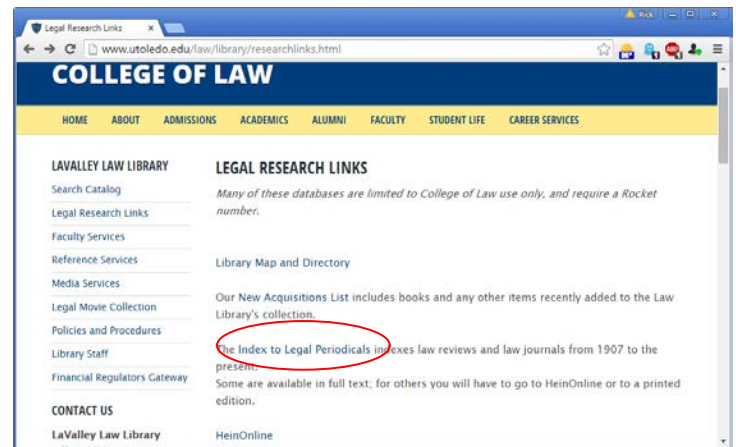


HOW TO FIND LEGAL PERIODICALS in the LaValley Law Library



Start from the LaValley Law Library home page, and click on *Legal Research Links*.

Click on *Index to Legal Periodicals*, and enter your name and Rocket number on the next page if needed



Enter your search terms and adjust as needed. Try an Advanced Search to limit your results by date, author, title, and several other fields. Some of the results will be available in full text (just click on the PDF icon). For others you can click on the “Find It” button, which will usually take you to HeinOnline. Hein is an excellent source for law review and law journal articles, and includes content all the way back to Volume 1 for most journals – some as far back as the 1800s.

If there’s no direct link to your article: write the citation down, go back to our Legal Research Links page, choose Hein Online, and enter the citation there. You can view, print or save the PDF from Hein.

If the article you’re looking for isn’t in HeinOnline, or if you prefer to work with actual printed books, most of our journals are located upstairs on the fourth level of the library. If you can’t find the article in any format here at UT, check with a librarian. We may be able to get the article for you from another library.
