

EXAMPLES OF APA CITATION STYLE FOR COMMON BUSINESS SOURCES

(based on the 6th edition of the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association and the APA Style Guide to Electronic References)

Example of a journal article:

References page:

Gunasti, K., & Ross, W. (2010). How and when alphanumeric brand names affect consumer preferences. *Journal of Marketing Research*, 47(6), 1177-1192. doi:10.1509/jmkr.47.6.1177

In text citation: (Gunasti & Ross, 2010)

(A DOI (Digital Object Identifier) should be added when it is available. The DOI replaces the retrieval date and URL. If you are referencing an online article that you have reason to believe has been changed, that includes additional data or commentaries, or is an advanced online publication, you will need to add the date you retrieved the document and the URL.)

In text citation: (Wessel, 2007)

Example of an electronic report retrieved from an aggregated database:

Datamonitor. (2006, December). *Pharmaceuticals in the United States: Industry profile* (Reference Code 0072-0372). New York, NY: Author. Retrieved August 31, 2007, from the Business Source Complete database.

In text citation: (Datamonitor, 2006)

Example of an electronic copy of an annual report retrieved from a web page:

In text citation: (Pfizer, 2007)

- allows others to find the source
- helps justify recommendations
