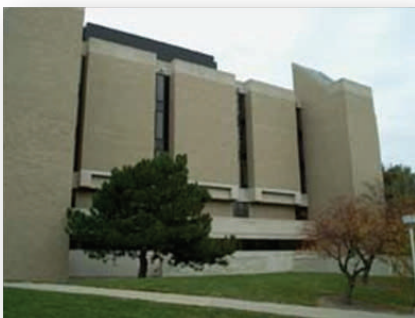
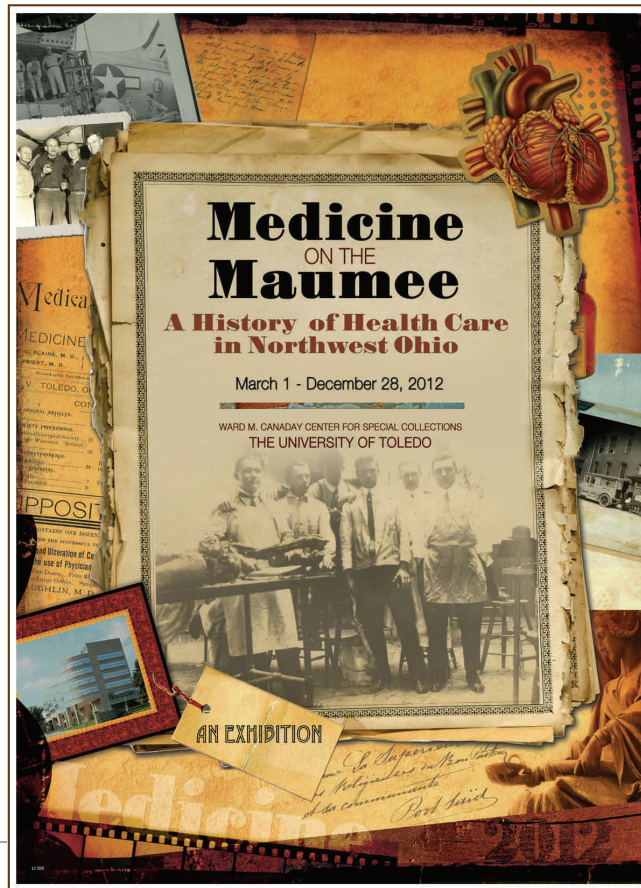

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The exhibition "Medicine on the Maumee: A History of Health Care in Northwest Ohio" opens Thursday, March 1, at 3 p.m. in the Ward M. Canaday Center for Special Collections in The University of Toledo's William S. Carlson Library. The free, public exhibit traces the history of medicine in our community from the earliest years of settlement to current day. It looks at epidemics that devastated the population, hospitals that sought to cure, doctors and nurses who provided care, and at how medicine became an industry.

Carlson Library Update



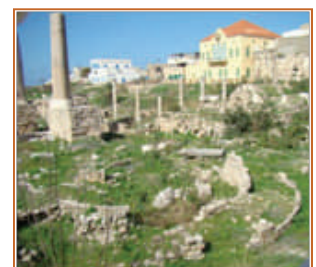
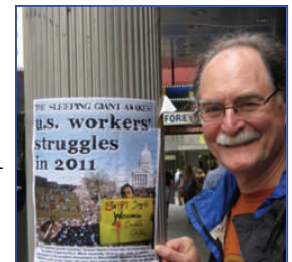
Construction for improved collaboration and student space continues at Carlson Library. Phase 1 (*March 5, 2012 to June 30, 2012*) for the Second Floor includes the following: new carpeting and ceiling tiles, color schemes from the cool color palette of blues, tans, and greens, and the industrial look of exposed pipes, girders, and concrete. In order to proceed, all classrooms have been closed and emptied, all equipment and furniture have

been removed, and student lockers are being moved to the Fourth Floor. In addition, six offices for Library faculty in the Reference and Instruction & Information Literacy Departments have been planned as well as a Writing Studio, a Center for Innovative Design, a large meeting room, and a gathering/lounge area. Plans for Phase 2 are being discussed at this time.



Visiting Lebanon, Australia, and Ghana on Sabbatical

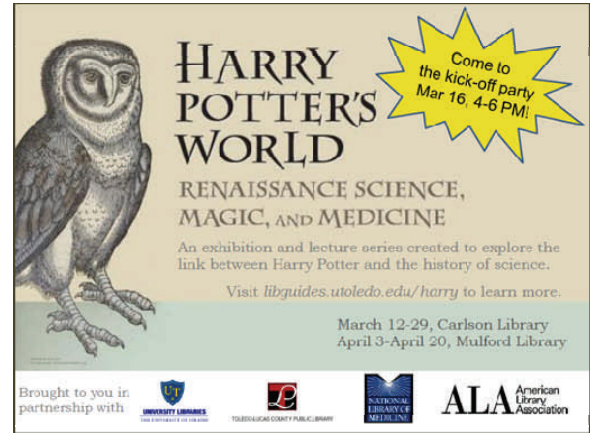
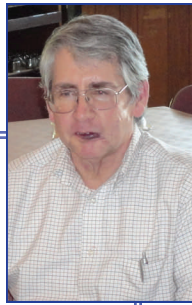
