

This guide will help get your research started with a list of basic information needs and some of the research tools available for your use. If you need assistance or directions, please ask a Reference Librarian (trained professionals who are there to assist you with your research needs).

Background Information

- For a summary of a topic use an encyclopedia (e.g. *Encyclopedia Britannica*)
- If the topic is within a specific discipline, use a **subject encyclopedia** (e.g. *Encyclopedia of Human Biology*)
- Search engines and meta-search engines are great resources when brainstorming (e.g. google.com or dogpile.com)

Articles (from newspapers, magazines, and journals)

To find articles, online-research databases are available. They can be searched by **name** of database or **subject**.

- For current news use a newspaper database (e.g. *America's Newspapers* or *Lexis Nexis Academic*)
- To search for articles in magazines and journals use a magazine/journal database (e.g. *Academic Search Complete*)
- For scholarly or research articles use a discipline-specific database (e.g. *Biological Abstracts*)

Books

- For books on a certain topic use a **Subject search** or **Keyword** search in the library catalog
- For books by a certain author use the **Author search** in the library catalog (last name first name: e.g. Woolf Virginia or Shakespeare, William)
- For books not owned by Carlson Library use **OhioLINK** (Ohio Library Information Network) or **ILL** (Interlibrary Loan)

Other Types of Information

- For general facts and statistics use almanacs, yearbooks, and statistical sources (e.g. *Information Please Almanac*, or *Statistical Abstract of the United States*)
- For maps use atlases (e.g. *National Geographic Atlas of the World*)
- For definitions of words use dictionaries and thesauri (e.g. *Oxford Dictionary of Slang*, *American Dictionaries of the English Language Before 1861*, *A Dictionary of Business and Management* (electronic resource))
- For information on people use biographies (e.g. *Notable Hispanic American Women*, *Notable American Philanthropists: Biographies of Giving and Volunteering*)
