

The University of Toledo is a part of OhioLINK, a statewide library and information network linking many university, college, and research libraries in Ohio. The faculty, students and staff at the University of Toledo can access this collective body of information through an easy-to-use online menu at selected computers in Carlson Library. In addition, faculty, staff and students can connect to OhioLINK from off-campus via the World Wide Web.

OhioLINK will provide you with access to:

- 1) [OhioLINK Central Catalog](#) which contains over 9.2 million unique titles and is growing daily. This central file shows the holdings of each of the institutions participating in OhioLINK. You search the OhioLINK Central Catalog to locate and borrow books, and to locate journals not owned by The University of Toledo Libraries. Books that are available at other schools may be requested and picked up at any UT Libraries Circulation Desk.
- 2) [OhioLINK Research Databases](#) which are online indexes. The indexes currently available are listed below. Here they are listed alphabetically, and on the web they are also grouped into subject categories.
- 3) [OhioLINK Digital Media Center](#) which contains non-print data such as satellite images, historic Sanborn maps, art and architecture images, foreign language instructional videos, and physics demonstration videos.
- 4) [OhioLINK Electronic Journal Center](#), a central access point for over 6300 online scholarly journals from select publishers.

## OHIOLINK & UNIVERSITY OF TOLEDO RESEARCH DATABASES:

### [Academic Search Complete](#)

The world's largest scholarly, multi-discipline, full text database designed specifically for academic institutions. This resource indexes over 4300 periodicals and contains full text for over 3400 scholarly publications. Academic Search Premier includes full-page images as well as color embedded images. This scholarly collection provides full text journal coverage for nearly all areas of academic study - including social sciences, humanities, education, computer sciences, engineering, language and linguistics, arts & literature, medical sciences, and ethnic studies.

### [ACM Digital Library \(1985-\)](#)

Bibliographic information, abstracts, index terms, reviews, and the full-text for ACM conference proceedings. ACM journals, magazines, and newsletters are also available at this site, as well as through the OhioLINK Electronic Journal Center.

### [African American Poetry Database](#)

Contains the full text of almost 3,000 poems written between 1760 and 1900. Poets included are among those listed in *Afro-American Poetry and Drama, 1760-1975*, by W.P. French et al. Each poem can be searched by the poet's name, the title of the poem, or text from any line of the poem. Related textual material such as dedications, epigraphs, and notes are included.

### [AGRICOLA](#)

Produced by the National Agricultural Library, *AGRICOLA* provides citations to journal articles, monographs, theses, patents, software, audio-visual materials, and technical reports encompassing all aspects of agriculture and allied disciplines.

### [Alt HealthWatch](#)

Focuses on the many perspectives of complementary, holistic and integrated approaches to health care and wellness. It offers an immediate resource of full text articles, from more than 170 international, and often peer reviewed, reports, proceedings, association and consumer newsletters. In addition, there are hundreds of pamphlets, booklets, special reports, original research and book excerpts.

### [America: History and Life \(1964 -\)](#)

An index to the history of the United States and Canada from prehistory to the present. The database comprises bibliographic entries for journal articles, book and media reviews, articles in collections and dissertations. Updated quarterly.

[American Drama](#) (1714-Present)

*American Drama* currently contains more than 700 plays from over 300 dramatists. When finished, *American Drama* will feature the complete texts of more than 2,000 plays written by American dramatists.

[American Periodical Series Online](#) (1741-1900)

Contains page images of more than 1,100 historic American magazines, journals, and newspapers. These resources illuminate the development of American culture, politics, and society across some 150 years. Articles can be searched by author, source, and words in the complete text.

[American Poetry 1600-1900](#) (17<sup>th</sup> - Early 20<sup>th</sup> Century)

Contains the full text of over 40,000 poems by more than 200 writers from the 17<sup>th</sup> to the early 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Each poem can be searched by the poet's name, the title of the poem, or text from any line of the poem. Also included are related textual material such as dedications, epigraphs, and notes.

[Annual Bibliography of English Language and Literature](#) (1920-1997)

Lists books, journal articles, book reviews, collections of essays, doctoral dissertations, and critical editions of literary works published anywhere in the world. The bibliography consists of 77 volumes beginning in 1920 and is issued annually in printed volumes. Subject areas covered by this work include English language syntax, phonology, exicology, English prose, fiction, textual studies, in addition to the traditional culture of song and dance.

[Anthropology Plus](#) (1984-)

Indexes journal articles, reports, commentaries, edited works, and obituaries in the fields of social, cultural, physical, biological, and linguistic anthropology, ethnology, archaeology, folklore, material culture, and interdisciplinary studies. Coverage is from the late 19<sup>th</sup> century to the present.

[AP Images](#)

The Archive is an electronic library containing approximately 500,000 of the AP's current photos and a selection of pictures from their 50 million image print and negative library. The Multimedia Archive also includes graphics, text and audio.

[Art Full Text](#) (1929-)

Indexes 400 leading international art publications, including English-language periodicals, yearbooks, and museum bulletins, as well as many European periodicals. Included are references to book reviews and to reproductions of works of art. You may limit your search to references to autobiographies, biographies, bibliographies, exhibitions, film reviews, interviews, and obituaries. Note: UT libraries subscribe to less than 50 of the publications covered in *Art Abstracts*.

[ARTFL \(French Literature\)](#)

Nearly 2,000 texts, ranging from classic works of French literature from Renaissance to 20<sup>th</sup> century.

[ArticleFirst \(OCLC\)](#) (1990-)

Indexes journal articles on many subjects,

[Arts & Humanities Citation Index](#) (1980-)

This Institute for Scientific Information database contains citations to more than 1,100 of the world's leading arts and humanities journals. Some of the disciplines covered include: archaeology, art, classics, folklore, history, languages, linguistics, literature, music, philosophy, religion, and theater. Use this database to trace research by a particular person or to discover articles that cite a particular person's work (cited author search).

[ATLA Religion Database](#) (1949-)

The premier index to journal articles, book reviews, and collections of essays in all fields of religion. This comprehensive bibliographic database spans 50 years covering the subdisciplines in the fields of theology and religion, plus religious research in related fields such as sociology, anthropology, psychology, history, medicine, law, and business. ATLA annually indexes more than 12,000 articles in and related to the field of religion from 575 fully and selectively indexed journals and 100 scanned journals, plus more than 8,000 essays in and related to the field of religion from more than 500 books, international in scope Abstracts are included for 1975-1985.

[The Bible in English](#) (10<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup> Century)

This database has the full text of 21 English language translations of the Bible, including Old English and Middle English translations. You can limit your search to certain editions, to time periods, or have a parallel comparison of up to four editions simultaneously. Notes on each translation, information about translators, and front and back matter from individual editions are given as well.

[\*Bibliography of American Literature\*](#) (1955-1991)

This reference work provides 40,000 records of the literary works of approximately 300 American writers from the American Revolution to 1930.

[\*Bibliography of Native North Americans\*](#)

Covers all aspects of native North American culture, history, and life including archaeology, multicultural relations, gaming, governance, legend, and literacy. Dates of coverage for included content range from the sixteenth century to the present. BNNA will appeal to anyone interested in exploring the contributions, struggles, and issues surrounding North America's indigenous peoples.

[\*Bibliography of the History of Art\*](#) (1973-)

Covering European and American art from late antiquity to the present, this database indexes and abstracts art-related books, conference proceedings and dissertations, exhibition and dealer's catalogs, and articles from more than 4,000 periodicals. Updated quarterly.

[\*Biography Reference Bank\*](#)

Biographical information on approximately half a million people, from antiquity to the present, along with thousands of images. BRB offers substantive narrative profiles, each about 2,000 words long, which are searchable by name, profession, title, place of origin, gender, race/ethnicity, titles of works, date of birth, date of death, keyword, and presence of images. Daily updates provide up-to-the-minute coverage of newsmakers.

[\*Biography Resource Center from Gale\*](#)

Biographical information on more than 220,000 people from throughout history, around the world, and across all disciplines and subject areas. The database also includes full-text articles from nearly 250 periodicals. Search for people based on one or more personal facts such as birth and death years and places, nationality, ethnicity, occupation or gender, or combine criteria to create a highly-targeted custom search. Access available for University of Toledo campus.

[\*Biological Abstracts\*](#) (1980-)

Also known as *Biosis*, this database contains abstracts to articles in over 5,500 life science journals. International in scope, it includes research in the fields of biology, botany, biochemistry, biotechnology, pharmacology and zoology. Updated quarterly.

[\*Business & Company Resource Center from Gale\*](#)

The database contains detailed information on 448,000 U.S. and international companies, thorough histories and chronologies of major companies, and in-depth coverage of over 1,000 major U.S. and global industries including full-text essays, rankings, market shares, trade and professional associations, and statistical analyses.

[\*Business & Industry\*](#) (1994-2006)

A broad-based full-text business information database which includes coverage from over 900 trade and business publications covering business events in over 190 countries around the world. B&I draws business news, facts and events from trade publications, national, international, regional newspapers, business dailies, and newsletters. This database focuses on facts, figures, key events, market information and intellectual property information.

[\*Business Source Complete\*](#)

*Business Source Complete* is a scholarly business database providing bibliographic and full text content. *Business Source Complete* provides full text journals in all disciplines of business, including marketing, management, MIS, POM, accounting, finance and economics. Additional full text, non-journal content includes financial data, books, monographs, major reference works, book digests, conference proceedings, case studies, investment research reports, industry reports, market research reports, country reports, company profiles, SWOT analyses and more. *Business Source Complete* contains indexing and abstracts for the most important scholarly business journals back to 1886, searchable cited references for many journals, and detailed author profiles for the most-cited authors in the database.

[\*Chicano Database\*](#) (1967-)

A comprehensive bibliographic resource for information about Mexican-American topics and the only specialized database for Chicano reference. It indexes journal articles about Chicanos and also covers (1992 to the present) the broader Latino experience of Puerto Ricans, Cuban Americans, and Central American immigrants. Updated Quarterly.

[\*CIAO - Columbia International Affairs Online Database\*](#) (1991-)

Designed to be the most comprehensive source for theory and research in international affairs, CIAO publishes a wide range of scholarship that includes working papers from university research institutes, occasional papers series from NGOs, foundation-funded research projects, and proceedings from conferences. Each section of CIAO is updated with new material on a regular schedule. Access available for University of Toledo campus.

[CINAHL](#) (*Nursing & Allied Health*, 1982-)

Index of English-language nursing journals, though, many journals from allied health fields are also included, for instance, emergency services, health education, occupational therapy, respiratory therapy, etc. Selected biomedical journals, and consumer health publications, some nursing dissertations, educational software in nursing, and some chapters in books are also indexed.

[Clase and Periodica](#)

Index of articles, essays, book reviews, monographs, conference proceedings, technical reports, interviews and brief notes published in over 2,600 journals edited in 24 different countries of Latin America and the Caribbean, as well as from publications that focus on Pan-American issues.

[Classical Music Library](#)

A multi-label database (currently over 32 labels) of recordings for listening and learning.

[Communication & Mass Media Complete](#)

Index, abstracts, and full text for journals in communication and mass media.

[Communication Sciences and Disorders Dome \(ComDisDome\)](#)

The Dome is the premier information service for speech-language pathologists, audiologists, and students. Includes Articles, Books, Dissertations, Grants, Web Resources, Selected Authors and Institutions.

[Compendex](#) (1969 -) & [Compendex Historical](#) (1884-1968)

Ei Compendex\*Plus abstracts over 2,600 journals in all fields of engineering as well as related disciplines. It also included conference papers, proceedings, books, and technical reports. This database uses the same subject headings as the Engineering Index, and includes a thesaurus feature.

[Computers & Applied Sciences Complete](#)

*Computers & Applied Sciences Complete* covers the spectrum of the applied sciences, representing knowledge on traditional engineering challenges and providing material for research concerning the business and social implications of new technology. CASC provides indexing and abstracting for academic journals, professional publications, and other reference sources. Full Text is available for more than 500 periodicals. Subject areas include the many engineering disciplines, computer theory, and new technologies.

[Contemporary Women's Issues](#) (1992-2006)

Full-text database. Journals, newsletters, and research reports from non-profit groups, government and international agencies are easily accessed through CWI. Information on women in over 190 countries is compiled in a single collection bringing together such disciplines as sociology, psychology, health, education, business and political science. No longer updated.

[Criminal Justice Abstracts](#) (1968-)

The database contains indexes and summaries of international journal articles, books, and governmental and non-governmental reports on a wide range of topics in criminal justice, including crime trends, crime prevention and deterrence, juvenile delinquency, juvenile justice, police, courts, punishment and sentencing. Updated quarterly.

[Criminal Justice Periodicals Index](#) (1981-)

Information on virtually any criminal justice topic, including corrections administration, law enforcement, social work, industrial security, drug rehabilitation, and criminal and family law. The database offers full text coverage for about 50 of the titles most frequently accessed by criminal justice researchers. CJPI also include complete indexing and abstracts for another 140 relevant U.S. and international journals. Access available for University of Toledo campus.

[Dissertation Abstracts](#) (1861-) (also known as *Proquest Dissertations & Theses*)

This database contains records of more than one million dissertations and master's theses from institutions mainly in the United States. Some European dissertations have been added since 1988. The database provides abstracts for dissertations added since 1980, and short abstracts for masters theses since 1988. Copies of recent UT dissertations are available for free, by downloading a PDF file. Copies of non-UT dissertations are available for a fee from the database publisher.

[Early American Fiction](#) (1774-1850)

Contains 440 works of 80 novelists and short-story writers, 1774-1850. This database comprises the full texts of the first editions of American novels and short stories written before 1850 by authors of significance during their lifetimes.

### [EconLit](#) (1969-)

EconLit is a comprehensive, indexed bibliography with selected abstracts of the world's economic literature, produced by the American Economic Association. It includes coverage of over 400 major journals as well as articles in collective volumes (essays, proceedings, etc.), books, book reviews, dissertations, and working papers licensed from the Cambridge University Press Abstracts of Working Papers in Economics.

### [Editions and Adaptations of Shakespeare](#)

The complete text of eleven major editions of Shakespeare's works from the First Folio to the Cambridge edition of 1863-6, twenty-four separate contemporary printings of individual plays, selected apocrypha and related works and more than 100 adaptations, sequels and burlesques from the seventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth centuries.

### [Education Full Text](#) (1983-)

This database covers 400 international English language journals in all areas of education (pre-school, elementary, secondary, higher and adult education, etc.). Some topics presented are international education, language arts, science and mathematics, and special education. Many articles after 1996 are available in full text. Citations to law cases and to book reviews are included.

### [Education Research Complete](#)

A bibliographic and full text database covering scholarly research and information relating to all areas of education. The database provides indexing and abstracts for more than 1,500 journals, as well as full text for more than 750 journals. This database also includes full text for more than 100 books and monographs, and full text for numerous education-related conference papers.

### [Eighteenth Century Fiction](#)

Eighteenth Century Fiction provides the complete text of 96 works of prose fiction, written in the British Isles between 1700 and 1780. You can browse through a list of authors and titles, or search the full text by keywords.

### [English Poetry 600-1900](#)

Contains the full text of over 160,000 poems written in English by approximately 1,350 poets between the years 600 and 1900. Each poem can be searched by the poet's name, the title of the poem, or text from any line of the poem. Also included are related textual material such as dedications, epigraphs, and notes.

### [English Prose Drama](#)

Complete full-text of over 1800 English plays written in pros from the 16<sup>th</sup> through 19<sup>th</sup> centuries. Based on plays listed in the *New Cambridge Bibliography of English Literature* that were written for the stage and wholly or primarily in prose.

### [English Verse Drama](#)

English Verse Drama contains the full text of over 2200 plays by more than 500 named authors and 300 anonymous works, from the late 13<sup>th</sup> Century through the 19<sup>th</sup> Century. Includes materials listed in the *New Cambridge Bibliography of English Literature*, selecting materials that are written or intended for the stage and wholly or primarily in verse. You may browse a list of playwrights or plays, or you may search by playwright, title, cast list, genre, or spoken line.

### [Environment Complete](#)

Covers applicable areas of agriculture, ecosystem ecology, energy, natural resources, marine & freshwater science, geography, pollution & waste management, environmental technology, environmental law, public policy, social impacts, urban planning, and more. *Environment Complete* contains citations for articles from 1,200 domestic and international journals, as well as 100 monographs.

### [ERIC](#) (1966-)

The Educational Resources Information Center database consists of two indexes which cover professional education journals and non-periodical literature such as lesson plans, curriculum guides, conference papers, etc. Use the *Thesaurus* to search the database by subject. Many of the ERIC documents (EDs) are available on microfiche or online (after 1993). 0020

### [Film & Television Literature Index](#)

Covers the literature of television and film writing, including film & television theory, preservation & restoration, writing, production, cinematography, technical aspects, and reviews. It provides cover-to-cover indexing and abstracts for more than 300 publications, and selected coverage of 300 more.

### [FRANCIS](#) (1984-)

Covers a wide range of multilingual, multidisciplinary information in the humanities (63%), social sciences (33%), and economics (4%). FRANCIS is strong in religion, the history of art, and literature, with particular emphasis on current trends in European and world literature. Many abstracts are in French.

### [Garden, Landscape, & Horticulture Index](#)

Topics include horticulture, botany, garden and landscape design & history, ecology, plant and garden conservation, garden management, and horticultural therapy. This index is designed for gardening enthusiasts, professionals, and students of horticulture and of garden and landscape design & history. *Garden, Landscape & Horticulture Index* covers general gardening serials of national, international, and regional interest, and serials devoted to specialty gardens and plant groups, most published in English.

#### [Gender Studies Database](#)

Combines *Women's Studies International* and *Men's Studies* databases with the coverage of sexual diversity issues. Source documents include professional journals, conference papers, books, book chapters, government reports, discussion and working papers, theses & dissertations and other sources. Several thousand links to freely available and indexed full-text articles and documents on the Web are available, including carefully selected and important websites.

#### [GenderWatch](#) (1970-)

Full text database of publications that focus on the impact of gender across a broad spectrum of subject areas. Provides in-depth coverage of the subjects that are uniquely central to women's lives, as well as content on the impact of gender and gender roles in broader contexts. Access available for University of Toledo campus.

#### [GeoRef](#) (1785- )

Established by the American Geological Institute in 1966, contains references to geoscience journal articles, books, maps, conference papers, reports and theses. Covers the geology of North America from 1785 to the present and the geology of the rest of the world from 1933 to the present. Includes references to all publications of the U.S. Geological Survey.

#### [The Gerritsen Collection--Women's History Online](#)

In the late 1800s, Dutch physician Aletta Jacobs and her husband C.V. Gerritsen began collecting books and periodicals reflecting the evolution of a feminist consciousness and women's rights. By 1945, The Collection was the greatest single source for the study of women's history in the world, with materials spanning four centuries and fifteen languages. This online resource delivers two million page images exactly as they appeared in the original printed works.

#### [GPO Monthly Catalog](#) (1976-)

Database of publications of the United States' Government Printing Office.

#### [HarpWeek: The Civil War & Reconstruction](#) (1857-1871)

A searchable full-text database of the *Harper's Weekly* newspaper covering 1857 to 1871.

#### [Health Source: Consumer Edition](#)

Searchable full text for over 190 journals, as well as abstracts and indexing for over 200 general health, nutrition and professional health care publications.

#### [Health Source: Nursing/Academic Edition](#)

Provides nearly 590 scholarly full text journals focusing on many medical disciplines. Also featured are abstracts and indexing for over 625 journals. Coverage of nursing and allied health is particularly strong.

#### [Historical Abstracts](#) (1955- )

Covers world history, excluding the U.S. and Canada. Indexes journal articles, books, articles in collections and dissertations. Coverage is 1450 to the present.

#### [History E-Books Project](#)

Includes almost 1000 titles selected by historians in the fields of American, Asian, European, and Middle Eastern history, and the history of technology. The History E-Book Project will continue to add titles and fields, including forthcoming books in Latin American and African history, in 2005.

#### [History of Science, Technology, & Medicine](#) (1976-)

The database contains references to journal articles, conference proceedings, books, book reviews, and dissertations in all languages in the field of science and technology. Abstracts are included in some records. Updated annually.

#### [Humanities International Complete](#)

Provides cover-to-cover indexing and abstracting for over 1,900 titles, and full text of hundreds of journals books and other publications in the humanities. The database includes citations and abstracts for articles, essays and reviews, as well as original creative works including poems, fiction, photographs, paintings and illustrations.

#### [In The First Person : an Index to Letters, Diaries, Oral Histories and Personal Narratives](#)

In The First Person is a landmark index to English language personal narratives, including letters, diaries, memoirs, autobiographies,

and oral histories of more than 300,000 individuals. Working with archives, repositories, publishers, and individuals we've indexed first person narratives from hundreds of published volumes - those that are publicly available on the Web and those that are held by repositories and archives around the world.

#### [Index to 19<sup>th</sup> Century American Art Periodicals](#)

Indexes 42 art journals published in the US during the 19th century, providing nearly complete coverage of journals from this period. The Index describes the entire journal contents – articles, art notes, illustrations, stories, poems, and advertisements – and offers information on popular culture and industry, artists and illustrators, painting, sculpture, drawing, photography, architecture and design, exhibitions and sales, decorations, and collecting.

#### [INSPEC](#) (1969-) and [INSPEC Archive](#) (1898-1968)

INSPEC provides access to the world's scientific and technical literature in physics, electrical engineering, electronics, communications, control engineering, computers and computing, and information technology. Over 4000 scientific and technical journals and some 2000 conference proceedings, as well as numerous books, reports and dissertations are scanned each year by INSPEC staff for relevant articles to abstract and index for inclusion in the database. Patent information was included in the database from 1969 through 1976 only.

#### [International Bibliography of Theatre and Dance](#) (1984-)

Index to journal articles, books, book articles and dissertation abstracts on all aspects of theatre and performance.

#### [International Pharmaceutical Abstracts](#) (1970-)

Indexes pharmaceutical literature; coverage includes clinical and technical drug information, pharmacy practice, pharmaceutical education, and legal aspects of pharmacy and drugs. Over 750 journals published worldwide and abstracts of papers presented at major meetings are indexed. Access available for University of Toledo campus.

#### [International Political Science Abstracts](#)

*International Political Science Abstracts* includes current indexing and abstracts of the world's leading journals in political science.

#### [LearningExpress Library](#)

Targeted, skill-building interactive courses in math, reading, and writing, as well as hundreds of online interactive practice tests that prepare them for several types of exams including grade school achievement tests, the SAT, GED, U.S. Citizenship, and civil service positions. Complete answer explanations accompany each response so that patrons understand why a particular answer is correct or incorrect.

#### [Legal Colleciton](#)

A collection of respected, scholarly peer-reviewed publications including law journals, documents, and case studies, offering full text for nearly 250 of the world's most respected, scholarly law journals.

#### [Lexis-Nexis Academic](#)

Covers news, legal, business, and reference information. Full text access to newspapers, legal journals, and business documents is included as well transcripts of news programs from ABC, NBC, CBS, and NPR. State profiles, biographical information, and quotation searching are also available.

#### [Lexis-Nexis Congressional](#)

A database of information about U.S. legislation. Includes the full text of bills from the House of Representatives and the Senate, their legislative histories, the debate on bills from the Congressional Record, and multiple versions of bills. You can also find information about legislators, including biographical information, contact information, and voting histories. A variety of search allows you to look for bills by topic, bill number, or sponsoring congressperson.

#### [LGBT Life](#)

Provides indexing and abstract coverage of the world's literature regarding Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender issues. LGBT Life covers traditional academic, cultural, lifestyle, and regional publications plus data mined from additional periodicals. Disciplines covered by LGBT Life include civil liberties, culture, employment, family, history, politics, psychology, religion, sociology and more. Documents are described using a specialized LGBT Thesaurus containing over 6,300 terms.

#### [Library, Information Science, & Technology Abstracts](#) (1965-)

Indexes periodicals, books, research reports and proceedings. Subject coverage includes librarianship, classification, cataloging, bibliometrics, online information retrieval, information management and more..

#### [Literary Reference Center](#)

A comprehensive database that provides a broad spectrum of information on thousands of authors and their works across literary disciplines and timeframes. This database indexes the international journal literature on biomedicine. The references are found in approximately 3,700 medical journals published in the U.S. and abroad. The information is categorized by the National Library of Medicine subject headings.
