<u>Elective Description/Requirements:</u>	The student will function as a part of the emergency team whose members handle all phases of emergency patient management ranging from triage to final disposition. The student will have the primary responsibility to examine and manage emergency patients, in consultation with attending faculty. This elective is NOT an acting internship.

Perform and document an accurate history and physical examination 2. Order and interpret test data, including laboratory, EKG, and radiographic/imaging studies 3. Demonstrate interpersonal communication with patients, families, physicians, EMS personnel, and ancillary staff 4. Demonstrate proficiency in procedural treatment skills including suturing, wound management, immobilization of injuries, and other emergency procedures, under appropriate attending physician supervision 5. Develop treatment plans for emergency patients with medical and surgical problems 6. Identify acutely ill patients and develop a plan for immediate stabilization 7. Recognize acute medical conditions and identify triage priorities 8. Utilize hospital consultative services appropriately.
