<b><u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u></b>	Students will be integrated into the service as a member of the surgical team, participating in all aspects of patient management, both inpatient and outpatient. The student will be expected to complete at least 40 hours per week on the service. Each acting intern must complete two on-line modules to prepare the acting intern for his/her role as teachers of junior medical students.
