Requirements: Student(s) will assist in consultations and management of a wide variety of patients with pulmonary diseases. This will include Inpatient and outpatient consultations, hospital wards and MICU patients. Participation in procedures including bronchoscopies, intubations, lung and chest wall biopsies, cardiopulmonary exercise testing and pulmonary function testing will occur throughout the month. A didactic and bedside lecture course related to the pathophysiology of pulmonary diseases will be presented.
