 Elective Description/
 Requirements: The students will have an immersive learning opportunity in Population Health as they hear from regional experts in public health via small group discussions followed by actual field experiences in which they will participate in food safety courses and restaurant inspections, environmental health inspections including education and evaluation methods for lead poisoning. They will learn basic concepts in infectious disease epidemiology, from the importance of immunizations to hospital reporting of infectious diseases to the Health Department and the epidemiologist's role in disease intervention. Discussions will include opiate addiction in the community and the use of naloxone. They will spend time with the Minority Health Director in addition to discussing emerging strategies to address social determinants of health and the use of vital Community Health Assessment data.
