**Elective Description/Requirements:** The PM&R clinical elective focuses on the impairments and disabilities, which may accompany a variety of illnesses. Students in the 4-week rotation will have the opportunity to experience the breadth of pediatric physical medicine and rehabilitation. The educational experience will occur Monday through Friday. The hours each day for training will average 8, but may be more depending upon the attending, clinic schedule, and student interest.

PC2; PC9	Distinguish the etiology using physical examination and laboratory data and then implement a treatment strategy under supervision.
