

<b><u>Title of Clerkship:</u></b>	Advanced Urology Acting Internship – UTMC and StVMMC
<b><u>Elective Type:</u></b>	Acting Internship
<b><u>Department:</u></b>	Department of Urology
<b><u>Clerkship Site:</u></b>	The University of Toledo Medical Center and St. Vincent Mercy Medical Center

<b><u>Number of students per block:</u></b>	1 at each hospital
<b><u>Faculty:</u></b>	All full-time and volunteer Urology Faculty
<b><u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u></b>	This clerkship is designed to expose students to a variety of urologic disorders seen in an inpatient or outpatient setting. Designed for students considering a career in Urology or a surgical discipline. Students will be designated as an Acting Intern with increased responsibility for patient management – under supervision. The student will also be exposed to the variety and complexity of urologic diagnostic testing and surgical intervention.
<b><u>Length of Clerkship:</u></b>	4 weeks

Understand the normal anatomy of the urinary tract as it applies to urologic disorders K4. Describe common diseases presenting to the Urologist K5. Exhibit a refined ability in obtaining a history from patients, including sensitive areas such as sexual function and incontinence S4. Perfect the urologic physical examination S6. Display ability to assist in urologic diagnostic instrumentation and common urologic operations P5. Demonstrate appropriate demeanor in the treatment of urologic disorders

Operating Room: observation of surgical procedures with intraoperative instruction</li> <li>3. Conferences: biweekly conferences with residents and staff, monthly Grand Rounds</li> <li>4. Hospital-based: rounds on inpatients with residents with review and discussion of care</li> <li>5. Facilitated small-group weekly sessions</li> </ol>
<b><u>Evaluation methods employed:</u></b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Formative review of clinical performance</li> <li>2. Written evaluation</li> <li>3. Faculty/Resident Observation</li> </ol>
