<u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u>	The elective deals with in-hospital care of patients with infectious diseases and offers an approach to the diagnosis and management of complicated medical and surgical patients with infectious complications. There is emphasis on rational approaches to evaluation and management of general medical problems as well as their infectious complications. Laboratory instruction as to the interpretation of microbiologic tests and review of rational use of antimicrobial agents is stressed. Reading material for 4 weeks is given at the beginning of the rotation so that the student will cover all important topics in Infectious Diseases, even if a patient with that particular disease is not seen on consultation during the time of the rotation. Audiovisual materials are available for review of infrequently seen conditions.
