Elective Description/ Requirements: Designed for students going into Primary Care or related specialty. Will be exposed to common ears, nose and throat problems such as recurrent tonsillitis/adenoidectomy, otitis media/myringotomy and tube insertion, hearing loss/hearing aids, swallowing problems, hoarseness, dizziness, chronic ear disease, sinusitis/sinus surgery, head and neck cancer. Students will be integrated into the OR, may work in the Audiology and Speech Department and Vestibular Rehabilitation Department. This is a pass/fail course.
