<b><u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u></b>	This clerkship is designed to expose students to a variety of urologic disorders seen in an outpatient setting. Teaching will be conducted primarily in the outpatient clinics, on rounds and in the ambulatory operating rooms by residents and faculty in a one-on-one setting. The student will be exposed to patients presenting with a variety of disorders such as abnormal voiding, urinary tract pain, impotence, incontinence and renal failure
<b><u>Length of Clerkship:</u></b>	4 weeks

Operating Room: observation of surgical procedures with intraoperative instruction</li> <li>3. Conferences: biweekly conferences with residents and staff, monthly Grand Rounds</li> <li>4. Hospital-based: rounds on inpatients with residents with review and discussion of care</li> <li>5. Facilitated small-group weekly sessions</li> </ol>
