Requirements:

During the Pediatric Hem/Onc elective, students will have the opportunity to participate in the outpatient care of children with cancer an hematologic problems. The elective complements the intensive inpatient PHO experience, and allow the students to recognize that many patients who are acutely ill at the time of diagnosis recover from their morbidities and resume normal activities of childhood and adolescence, even while continuing to receive therap.
