<u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u>	Students will be integral members of the SCC service caring for the critically ill general surgery and trauma surgery patients. Students will work intimately with surgical and anesthesia residents assigned to the SCC Service and the SCC Attendings who round daily. Students attend daily rounds, trauma alerts, as well as M&M Conference and Grand Rounds. Each acting intern must complete two on-line modules to prepare the acting intern for his/her role as a teacher or junior medical student.
<u>Length of Clerkship:</u>	4 weeks.
