<u>Elective Description/ Requirements:</u>	The pediatric pulmonary medicine elective is composed of both outpatient and inpatient rotation. The inpatient rotation consists of the patients who are hospitalized at TCH under the primary pulmonary service or on a consultation basis. This also included patients in the neonatal ICU and pediatric ICU. The outpatient service at TCH offers exposure to a wide variety of pediatric pulmonary problems, including asthma, BPD, GERD, cystic fibrosis, infant apnea, etc. Pulmonary function tests and pulmonary physiology will be part of this elective. Monday through Friday, 8:30 am to 5 pm unless instructed otherwise.
