1. Demonstrate a surgical history and physical examination focusing on vascular disease
2. Management of patients with vascular disease
3. Understanding of fluids, clotting mechanisms, renal, pulmonary, and cardiac status
4. Demonstrate an understanding of hemodynamics as seen in the vascular laboratory
5. Assist in angiographic studies
6. Interpret diagnostic studies including, angiographic studies and vascular lab procedures
7. Demonstrate an understanding on the treatment of vascular disease
8. Manage and monitor the pre and postoperative vascular patient
9. Accurately present patient information concerning the patient's condition, progress and results of laboratory and radiographic/imaging studies
10. Write a complete and accurate daily progress note including interpretation of results of laboratory and radiographic/imaging studies
11. Writ patient orders under the direct supervision of a licensed physician.
