Political scientist and filmmaker Roy Germano will present and discuss his award-winning documentary The Other Side of *Immigration.* Based on over 700 interviews in Mexican towns where about half the population has left to work in the United States, this film asks why so many Mexicans come to the U.S. and explores what happens to the families and communities they leave behind.
