Stephanie is currently working towards a Masters of Public Health (MPH) in Epidemiology through the 3 + 2 program offered by the Department of Environmental Sciences, University of Toledo. This 3 + 2 program allows Stephanie to earn her Bachelors and Masters degrees in five years rather than six in the traditional program. The 3 + 2 program also allows her to continue her education while working full time as a biological technician in sampling water quality at Maumee State Park.
