Acceptance of Transfer Credit

1. Students will be granted credit for all college-level courses taken Summer 2005 and before at regionally accredited institutions of higher learning for which they have earned a C or better.
2. Student will be granted credit for all college-level courses taken Fall 2005 or later at regionally accredited institutions of higher learning for which they have earned a D- or better.
3. Students who have completed an associate's degree from a state-assisted Ohio institution with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better will receive transfer credit for all college-level courses used toward the associate's degree for which they have earned a D- or better.

Note: Acceptance of course credit does not guarantee applicability toward degree programs.

Transfer Credit Evaluation

Your transfer credits have been equated to UT courses or "pseudo courses." If UT does not have a course that is equivalent to a course you have taken, we use pseudo course codes to allow the courses to be applied to degree requirements on the Degree Audit Report (DAR). Courses that have been identified as electives will be used to meet degree requirements whenever appropriate.

Your evaluation has been prepared by your college. If you switch to another college at UT, you should request that your transfer credits be reviewed and re-evaluated, if appropriate, by that college.

Take Action

Submit a course syllabus: If you have any courses that appear as ZCRSDES or ZDPT EVAL you **must** provide syllabi to enable us to evaluate these courses before you take courses at UT in the same subject area. If you do not have these courses evaluated, they cannot be applied to requirements on DAR, and you run the risk of taking an equivalent course at UT. Duplicate course work will not be counted toward degree requirements. You have one academic semester to supply the course syllabus; if you do not the course will become an elective credit.

Turn in all transcripts: Students are required to submit transcripts from all institutions attended. Failure to do so will be considered as academic dishonesty. Students with in-progress course work at the time of application to UT will need to submit a final transcript after the courses have been completed.

Transfer Credit and Major/Minor & UT Core GPA

Students transferring to UT in Spring 2007 or later, including transfer readmits, must meet minimum GPA requirements in their LLSS, NSM, and CoCA majors and minors with both (1) the grades of all courses attempted at UT and (2) in a second calculation, the grades of all courses attempted at all institutions (including UT). The grades of all courses (from all institutions) which are used by those students to satisfy UT Core requirements must be used in the calculation of the UT Core GPA.

UT students who attend other institutions as guests or transient students in Fall 2008 or later must also meet minimum GPA requirements in their LLSS, NSM, and CoCA majors and minors with (1) the grades of all courses attempted at UT and (2) in a second calculation, the grades of all courses attempted at all institutions (including UT). The grades of all courses (from all institutions) which are used by those students to satisfy UT Core requirements must be used in the calculation of the UT Core GPA.



Level of Transfer Credit

All undergraduate baccalaureate degree programs offered through LLSS, NSM, and CoCA require that students complete 64 credits of course work offered at the 2000-4000 (or sophomore to senior) levels and 32 credits of course work offered at the 3000-4000 (or junior to senior) levels.

The level requirement is determined by the level of the UT course evaluation. For example, if the course was originally taken at the 200 or 2000 level but is equivalent to a 3000/4000 level course at UT this course will be counted as upper division credit. However, if a course was originally taken at the 300, 3000, 400, or 4000 level but is equivalent to a 1000/2000 level course at UT this course will not be counted as upper division credit

Degree Audit Reporting (DAR)

The DAR is a course tracking system that pulls information from your UT transcript to track your progress toward degree. Transfer courses that have been completed and for which equivalencies have been assigned will appear on the DAR. Transfer courses that are still in-progress on your transcript will not appear on the DAR until you send a final transcript that shows that the courses have been completed and UT equivalencies have been assigned.

THE DAR is provided as a tool for you to use to monitor your progress toward degree and to help you choose appropriate courses each semester, but it does not determine graduation. All students are advised to review the DAR with their faculty advisers on a regular basis to ensure timely completion of their desired programs.

Residency Requirement

Transfers from other institutions who are seeking a degree in LLSS, NSM, or CoCA must earn at least 30 credits at UT, including 12 credits in the major field (Psychology requires 22 credits in the major field at UT) and 9 credits in the minor field. Minors are optional.
