I am writing to request that The University of Toledo Advancement Council review and approve the naming of the Carl Joseph Memorial Reading Commons in the Carlson Library. The Carl Joseph Memorial Reading Commons will serve as a resource for UT students to learn about Carl Joseph and his interest in the Labor Movement, Peace and Social Justices. Mr. Joseph was killed in France on D-Day, June 6, 1944.

Albert Joseph, Carl's brother established a planned gift in 2002 that would benefit the Carlson Library by purchasing books in the areas of interest to Carl. This fund is now being realized with the death of Albert Joseph's wife. The Carl Joseph Memorial Reading Commons will display these books for UT students' use, as well as display the letters that Carl exchanged with UT President, Philip Nash.

The fund established by Albert Joseph has approximately \$200,000, which will be transferred to UT by year end. George Joseph, Albert's son, is the administrator of the trust and is working to expand the use of the trust monies. Mr. George Joseph has also made a personal gift that will support the renovation of two library tables to be placed in the Carl Joseph Memorial Reading Commons.
