### The Frank E. Horton Outstanding Professional Staff Association Award

The award will recognize a current member of the Professional Staff Association who displays an outstanding commitment to professional staff at The University of Toledo. The honoree will be a member of the Professional Staff Association and will demonstrate exemplary support, advocacy, and service to professional staff at The University of Toledo, which can include but not limited to:

- Service on University of Toledo committees representing the interests of professional staff
- Past membership on Professional Staff Council\* (Current members of the Professional Staff Council and retirees are not eligible to receive this award)
- Current or past membership on Professional Staff Association committees
- Engagement in campus and community events that strengthen the presence of professional staff on campus.
- The University of Toledo's positive impact on the neighboring community, the City of Toledo, and Northwest Ohio.
- Demonstration of pride and promotion of The University of Toledo and its endeavors

The award is named for past UT President Frank Horton, who in 1992 was instrumental in establishing the PSA as an officially recognized organization on campus. The main purpose of the PSA is to serve all professional staff as a sounding board for ideas and pool of resources and act as a conduit to enhance communication between the President's office and professional staff.

### **Nomination Process**

**The nomination period will be from April 17 – April 28**. Professional Staff Council members will identify five (5) nominees for the award at the PSC Council meeting on May 2nd/3rd. PSA members will then select their top candidate for the award through electronic vote. The voting period will open May 8 and run through May 12. The nominee who receives the most votes will be announced as the inaugural recipient of the Frank E. Horton Professional Staff Association Award at the PSA annual meeting on Tuesday, May 23rd.

#### PSA SUPPORTS THE EBERLY CENTER'S KATE'S CLOSET WITH CLOTHING DRIVE

The Catharine S. Eberly Center for Women has been a reliable resource for women at the University and in the community since 1978. Specializing in personal and professional development opportunities particularly for those facing transition, the Eberly Center programming has evolved to include the Women's Success Series, computer classes, a film and lecture series, Eberly Adventures and Kate's Closet.

Kate's Closet, added to the Eberly Center offerings in 2013, is a professional clothing closet open to students and community members in need of women's business professional clothing for job interviews, internships and similar. In a boutique like setting, volunteer consultants give feedback and professional styling tips while clients try on clothing from a selection pulled by staff based on a short questionnaire. Clients can "purchase" 50 points worth of clothing, typically two full outfits, up to four times per year.

"Kate's Closet doesn't just give away free clothing. We provide information about appropriate fit and styling, and encourage body positivity. We empower women to be confident in their presentation by removing the financial barrier to the clothing, accessories, shoes and bags that are expected in the professional environment," says Dr. Shanda Gore, associate vice president of the Catharine S. Eberly Center for Women and the Minority Business Development Center.


