

Competitive Awards for Faculty and Staff

Cottrell Scholars- <http://rescorp.org/cottrell-scholars/cottrell-scholar-award/guidelines-Dates> vary in March, May, August and November depending on the award

The Cottrell Scholar Award (CSA) is available to early career faculty at US research universities and primarily undergraduate institutions. Eligible applicants are tenure-track faculty members whose primary appointment is in a department of astronomy, chemistry or physics that offers at least a bachelor's degree.

- **Core-Due** August 1, 2016 for the 2017-2018 year. The Core Fulbright Scholar Program offers nearly 600 teaching, research or combination teaching/research awards in over 125 countries. Opportunities are available for college and university faculty and administrators.
- **Specialist** has rolling deadlines with next due date of November 4, 2016. The Fulbright Specialist Program (FSP) promotes linkages between U.S. scholars and professionals and their counterparts at host institutions overseas. The focus of the FSP is educational capacity building and the development of longer-term educational relationships, with grants to qualified U.S. faculty and professionals to engage in short-term collaborative two- to six-week projects at eligible institutions worldwide. Eligible Disciplines: *Agriculture, American (U.S.) Studies, Anthropology, Archaeology, Biology, Education, Business, Administration, Chemistry, Education, Communications & Journalism, Computer Science & Information Technology, Economics, Education, Engineering Education, Environmental Science, Law, Library Science, Math Education, Peace & Conflict Resolution Studies, Physics Education, Political Science, Public Administration, Public/Global Health, Social Work, Sociology and Urban Planning.*

Getty Scholar Grant applicants are researchers of all nationalities who are working in the arts, humanities, or social sciences. Recipients are in residence at the Getty Research Institute or Getty Villa, where they pursue their own projects free from academic obligations, make use of Getty collections, join their colleagues in a weekly meeting devoted to an annual research theme, and participate in the intellectual life of the Getty and may be in residence for one of six periods ranging from three to nine months.

Often characterized as “midcareer” awards, Guggenheim Fellowships are intended for men and women who have already demonstrated exceptional capacity for productive scholarship or exceptional creative ability in the arts. For citizens and permanent residents of the United States and Canada.

Medical Research Fellows Program aims to strengthen and expand the nation's pool of physician-scientists, dentist-scientists, and veterinarian-scientists. Requirements; U.S citizenship and can't be enrolled in a combined medical program. Pervious laboratory research experience is required.

Anyone who has made an original and significant contribution in basic or clinical medical research, or in public service, is eligible for nomination. Lasker Awards are highly competitive and are bestowed on individuals whose work opens new areas of biomedical science or public service. Award winners may reside in any country of the world.

Supports creative people and effective institutions committed to building a more just, verdant, and peaceful world. Funds Human rights, global conservation, security, makes cities a better place, understanding how technology is affecting children and society.

➤ Collaborative Research Grant - December 7, 2016

Collaborative Research Grants support interpretive humanities research undertaken by two or more collaborating scholars, for full-time or part-time activities for periods of one to three years.

➤ Research and development - June 8, 2017

Requires forming interdisciplinary project teams, bringing together participants with expertise in the humanities; in preservation; and in information, computer, and natural science.

Most of the Center's fellowships are unrestricted. Several, however, are designated for particular areas of research. These include a fellowship for a young woman in philosophy and fellowships for environmental studies, English literature, art history, Asian Studies, and theology.
