



The University of Toledo - Main Campus Policy

3360-30-21 IV-21 Residence hall policy.

(A) Visitation in residence halls.

The residence halls of The University of Toledo are not considered to be public buildings and are reserved for the use of the residents and their guests. As such the general public does not have open access to these buildings.

A guest is defined as any person who is not an assigned resident of the hall being visited. A host is defined as a person who is assigned to the particular student room being visited.

- (1) Hours for guests to visit in the Academic House, Carter Hall, Dowd/Nash/White, MacKinnon Hall, Parks Tower:

Monday ten a.m. – Friday two a.m.	ten a.m. – two a.m. each day
Friday ten a.m. – Monday two a.m.	twenty-four hours
- (2) Hours for guests to visit in The Crossings, International House:

Seven days	twenty-four hours

- (3) Operating guidelines:
 - (a) The needs of the roommates/suitemates to sleep, study, to be comfortable and otherwise free from interference and disruption as well as the right to privacy are paramount, and supercede the right to host a guest or building resident. Roommates reserve the right to reasonably refuse visitors to the room at any time.
 - (b) Guests are subject to the same rules, regulations, and expectations as a resident, and the host is responsible for informing their guest(s) of the rules, regulations and expectations in advance.
 - (c) Hosts assume full responsibility for the behavior and activities of their guest(s) regardless of whether the host is present to observe the behavior of the guest(s). However, for safety and security reasons, hosts are expected, whenever reasonably possible, to accompany their guests at all times.
 - (d) Guests who are acting inappropriately may be asked to leave the residence hall.
 - (e) Overnight guests must have the approval of the roommate(s)/suitemate(s) and the residence hall director. The stay is limited to two consecutive nights.
 - (f) On weekdays, between the hours of eight p.m. and two a.m., guests are required to check in at the residence hall information desk, present a photo identification and

sign the guest register. Guests are to check out at the same location when the visit is completed.

- (g) When the twenty-four hour period exists, between the hours of eight p.m. and eight a.m., guests are required to check in at the residence hall information desk, present a photo identification and sign the guest register. Guests are to check out at the same location when the visit is completed.

(B) Required residence for students.

All single full-time freshman and sophomore students who are not living with parents or relatives are required to live in University residence halls and participate in the food program. Once residence hall space is fully committed, this requirement is waived.

(C) Convicted felons not permitted in a University housing facility.

Students having been convicted or having plead guilty to a felony offense defined as an offense of violence under section 2901.01(I) of the Revised Code or which involve the use, sale or distribution of a controlled substance in violation of the Ohio Revised Code shall not be permitted to reside in a University housing facility.
