(A) Policy Statement

Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) may administer medications following the Administration of Medications Policy 3364-110-05-03 and the following criteria.

(B) Purpose of Policy

To clarify the LPNs role in the Administration of medications.

(C) Procedure

- 1. The LPN must have a valid NAPNES or OOPNA medication card, or licensure signifying MEDS-IV.
- 2. An LPN administering medications must follow Policy No. 3364-110-05-03 "Administration of Medications."
- 3. An LPN may <u>not accept a verbal order for medication.</u>
- 4. The LPN role in the management of Intravenous Therapy is specified in Policy No. 3364-110-05-15 "Limited Intravenous Therapy Procedures for Qualified Licensed Practical Nurses" (with IV course)."
