## (A) Policy Statement

This facility will maintain for each chronic maintenance hemodialysis patient, a patient care plan in EPIC

## (B) Purpose of Policy

To ensure that each patient receives the appropriate modality of care and the appropriate care within the modality.

## (C) Procedure

EPIC contains a written care plan representing the selection of a suitable treatment modality and dialysis setting.

- a. The program is done within 30 days of the first chronic maintenance hemodialysis treatment.
- b. The care plan is developed by an inter-disciplinary professional team which includes the physician director of the Hemodialysis facility, the charge nurse, a dietician, and a social worker.
- c. The interdisciplinary care plan is formally reviewed and revised in writing by the interdisciplinary team monthly.
- 2. EPIC contains a patient care plan based upon the nature of the patient's illness, the treatment prescribed, and an assessment of the patient's needs.
  - a. The care plan is placed within 30 days of the first chronic maintenance hemodialysis treatment.
  - b. The care plan is personalized to reflect psychological, social, and functional needs of the patient and the care required to achieve long-term and short-term goals.
  - c. The care plan is developed by an inter-disciplinary team consisting of the physician responsible for the patient's E.S.R.D. care, charge nurse, a dietician, and a licensed social worker.
  - d. The care plan is reviewed and revised by the inter-disciplinary team monthly.
- 3. The patient, parent, or legal guardian, as appropriate, is involved in the development of the patient's care plan and the medical record contains documentation of this.
- 4. If the patient is transferred to another facility, a copy of the patient's care plan/multidisciplinary problem list is sent within one working day.

5. When a patient is admitted from another facility, the hemodialysis staff will call the referring facility and request a copy of the patient's care plan.
