## (A) Policy Statement

Clients identified for Community Psychiatric Supportive Treatment (CPST) services will meet specific criteria before admission.

## (B) Purpose of Policy

To maximize the reduction of symptoms of an individual's psychiatric condition in order to restore the individual's functioning to the highest level possible.

## (C) Procedure

- 1. Clients seeking services in the department may be referred to receive CPST services if they have the ability to take responsibility for managing his/her psychiatric condition and achieving and maintaining his/her rehabilitative and/or recovery goals. CPST recipients must:
  - a. Have the cognitive ability to be able to participate in and benefit from service and
  - b. Be an active participant in his/her treatment and care.
  - c. Be involved in active treatment by a licensed mental health professional within UTMC Department of Psychiatry
- 2. The service shall continue to be provided to the extent that the client's psychiatric symptoms continue to negatively impact his/her ability to function without mental health intervention.
- 3. The following will be exclusionary criteria and does not qualify as CPST service:
  - a. Transportation in and of itself;
  - b. Unallowable vocational job training activities include, but are not limited to, job shadowing, job coaching, teaching computer skills, math skills, or other trade skills;
  - c. Observing clients when not performing a therapeutic intervention (e.g., when client is watching television, resting, eating, etc.).
