## (A) Policy Statement

Chaplains in the Pastoral Care Department must comply with the guiding principles according to UTMC hospital dress code policy 3364-25-06. Professional attire and personal appearance must be maintained during working hours including all on call responses and during all occasions while representing UTMC.

## (B) Purpose of Policy

It is the policy of the Pastoral Care Department to observe high standards of personal appearance at all times. Proper dress, grooming, personal hygiene, adornment and overall appearance support a positive and professional atmosphere.

## (C) Procedure

In addition to hospital requirements, appropriate attire for chaplains is as follows:

- a. For gentlemen a shirt, tie, and dress slacks minimum; jacket/blazer is optional.
- b. Females may wear dress, skirt of appropriate length, and/or dress slacks, and shirt. Sweater or jacket is mandatory.
- c. No bare legs or feet, socks or hose must be worn at all times.
- d. All clothing must be clean and neatly pressed.

Personnel not in compliance may be asked to go home on their own time and return to work in appropriate attire. Employees may be disciplined up to and including discharge for not adhering to this policy.
