

INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES, INDIVIDUALIZED PROGRAM (IDVP)

The interdisciplinary studies, individualized program allows students who have completed 20 hours of college coursework to earn their bachelor's degree through nontraditional plans of study. These students can pursue specialized academic areas of interest that include:

Marketing and communications

Conservation and ecology

Helping professions

Health issues

Sports administration

And many more!

This program allows you to emphasize your personal and professional goals and interests through a plan of study that you direct.

Admission to IDVP

To be admitted to the IDVP, you must have a 2.0 cumulative GPA and a minimum of 20 semester hours of transfer credit. You may transfer up to 94 hours and apply them toward the degree.

Earning a bachelor's degree in the IDVP

The program must be interdisciplinary and intercollegiate. This major may not duplicate an existing major at UT, and must include 30 semester hours designed by the student and approved by the Faculty Review Committee. The program will include 39 semester hours at the 3000-4000 levels. The IDVP also has an online option, depending on your program focus.

With an IDVP degree

LIBERAL STUDIES PROGRAM

The liberal studies program is designed for working adults. This degree allows you to integrate your real-world experiences with formal learning to meet your personal learning goals and gain the rewards of academic achievement.

Admission

To be admitted to the liberal studies program, you must be 24 years of age or older. Transfer students must have cumulative GPAs of 2.0 or higher, and may transfer and apply up to 81 semester hours toward the degree.

Earning a bachelor's degree

The program requires a minimum of 30 semester hours in your program, as well as 124 total semester hours. Liberal studies allows you to earn credit through College Level Examination Program (CLEP) testing in general education areas.

With a liberal studies degree

Our graduates use their broad education to find employment opportunities in business, industry and service sectors. Many students also use the program as a pathway to graduate school or for personal fulfillment.

PROFESSIONAL STUDIES PROGRAM

The professional studies degree completion program combines minors in the high-demand areas from the College of Business and Innovation with customized programming from University College.

This degree completion option features minors and concentrations to develop professional effectiveness in the areas of information literacy, interpersonal communication and organizational culture.

This program is designed for associate degree graduates and transfer students. The professional studies degree courses are delivered on-campus, online or in a blended format.

Admission to professional studies


To be admitted to the professional studies program, you must have a 2.0 cumulative GPA, as well as an associate's degree or 60 hours completed. Students can transfer up to 90 hours toward the degree.

Bachelor's degree in professional studies

Earning a bachelor's degree in professional studies, you must complete 120 semester hours, including a minimum of 30 hours at the 3000-4000 levels. You can earn a Bachelor of Arts degree in professional studies, with three minor options in electronic commerce (e-commerce), entrepreneurship or professional sales.

With a professional studies degree

Students with degrees in professional studies have the skills and knowledge to successfully implement their own business ideas, develop and manage new products and innovations, and position themselves to take advantage of the demand for web developers, consultants and content managers.



GENERAL STUDIES (associate degree program)

Interested in an associate degree? Or, are you looking for a starting point toward your bachelor's? The general studies program at UT is the right fit for you.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE IN GENERAL STUDIES

The general studies program allows you to select a concentration area that meets your individual needs. You create a customized major by combining courses from one department with related courses from several other departments.

With an associate's degree in general studies, you can fold the degree into any of UT's bachelor's degree programs. Here's another great benefit: The program is so flexible that your coursework can be completed 100 percent online.

TEACH TOLEDO

This program is a collaboration between UT and Toledo Public Schools to encourage Toledo-area citizens to become the city's next generation of teachers. Students earn an Associate of Arts degree with a focus on urban education through coursework at TPS' Jones Leadership Academy. Students learn about the profession of teaching by interacting with teachers, children and families within the school system.



EXPLORATORY STUDIES PROGRAM

The exploratory studies program is designed to enhance your transition to the university setting, and to help you become successful in your academic pursuits. Advisors are available to help you decide on a major and meet the requirements you need to declare a major.

Exploratory studies serves students who are:

- Exploring college majors or preparing to transfer to The University of Toledo as an undecided major
- Planning to attend The University of Toledo, but have not yet met requirements to enter the program of their choice
- Taking classes, but not working on a degree

If you're undecided about your major, schedule an appointment with one of the academic advisors in exploratory studies.

If you're interested in entering one of University College's degree programs, you also can schedule an appointment with a specialized academic advisor.


PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT PROGRAM

The University of Toledo allows you to earn college credit for relevant work, volunteer and life experiences through our Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) program. You can earn up to 30 hours of college credit outside the traditional classroom.


Multiple methods translate prior learning into credit, including:

- National standardized exams, such as College Level Examination Program (CLEP) and Dantes Subject Standardized Tests (DSST)
- Credit by exam through UT's academic departments
- Evaluated, non-college programs, such as the American Council on Education (ACE) evaluated credit
- Military credit
- Portfolio assessment

TESTING SERVICES

Testing services include administration of placement and makeup testing, credit by exam, distance learning exams from other universities, and professional certification and licensing examinations.

The Main Campus Test Center works with UT faculty and many on-campus departments to provide several services, including:

- Makeup testing
- Placement testing
- Survey/feedback
- Residual ACT (ACT-R) test
- ITP-TOEFL test
- Tests for College Credit Plus students
- · Local students taking UT Online courses for special circumstances

PROGRAM 60

Program 60 provides Ohio residents age 60 and older the opportunity for personal enrichment. Students enroll in and attend UT courses at a reduced rate.

Eligibility requirements

- 60 years of age or older
- Ohio resident for the last 12 consecutive months
- Filed for admission to The University of Toledo

Participation guidelines

- Enrollment is limited to space availability as determined the Friday before the semester begins.
- The prospective student must meet the course prerequisites.
- The prospective student is responsible for adhering to all UT academic regulations.

The division offers the University's credit courses, degree programs and academic services at the workplace and other off-campus locations. We serve students who otherwise might be excluded from higher education due to distance or because their schedules prohibit them from taking on-campus courses. We provide programs on-site, online and in a hybrid approach, with courses offered days, evenings and weekends. Degree electives can be tailored to an organization's needs and are offered in a cohort format. We also offer on-site academic advising, and direct billing is available for companies with tuition reimbursement.

UT ONLINE

As a UT Online student, you'll interact with your professors and classmates through our web-based systems and have access to quick tech support if you encounter a snag.

UT Online consists of three departments responsible for focusing and advancing the capacity of online and blended courses and programs. These departments include:

Instructional Design and Development

The Department of Instructional Design and Development provides services to faculty who teach online and blended courses. Instructional designers and multimedia designers collaborate with faculty in course design, development and delivery.

Learning and Academic Technology

The Learning and Academic Technology department is responsible for supporting the UT Online-provided academic technologies from the technical infrastructure through faculty training and support. The department consists of two teams: Educational Technology Services and Technology Support. The Educational Technology Services team offers consultations with faculty regarding effective use of educational technologies in online, hybrid and classroom environments. The Technology Support team is responsible for managing the technology and infrastructure that supports the University's online learning programs and various academic technologies.

Faculty Services and Help Desk

The Department of Faculty Services and Help Desk coordinates the delivery of online and blended courses. The staff works with academic departments and University offices, as well as individual faculty and instructors.
