A reference work to help job seekers, students, and career changers focus their career options and learn more about jobs of interest; features the 500 best jobs with detailed descriptions, the fastest growth, best pay, and most openings from the Department of Labor's Occupational Information Network (O*NET).

College Majors and Careers Reference HF5382.5 .U5 P445 2003
A reference work to assist students in focusing their college program by linking majors with personality traits, interests, and occupations.

Encyclopedia of Careers and Vocational Guidance Reference HF5381 .E52
