APPETIZERS

Intake

A formal meeting to learn more about the program and eligibility requirements and services.

GPA Calculators

A calculator for all students. Helps students understand the impact of one class or one semester on their overall GPA and academic goals.

LASSI

The LASSI is an assessment of students' awareness about the use of learning and study strategies related to skill, will and self-regulation components of strategic learning.

GRE/GMAT TEST PREPARATION

Test preparatory software for students considering graduate school is available.

ENTREES

Lunch N Learn Workshops

A series of informal 50-minute workshops developed to help students improve their study skills, familiarize themselves with campus resources, and develop effective social skills. Both small group and one-to-one workshops are available.

SKLS 1150 Course

A three-credit hour course designed to help students adjust to UT's campus community, develop a better understanding of college-level work, and refine their academic skills to reach their full potential.

SSS Advising

A Student Education Plan is developed with each new participant. As a contract between the participant and the SSS adviser, this plan identifies specific academic/support needs and strategies for addressing those needs.

SSS staff members serve as advisers for all participants throughout their tenure at UT. SSS staff members have the advantage of knowing the individual and unique needs of their students.

SSS provides confidential personal support, crisis intervention, and referral services. Students are guided to leadership opportunities on campus and are supported in leadership development.

Academic Performance Monitoring

SSS advisers will monitor the academic progress of all participants and provide intervening advisement to help students successfully persist in their programs of study.
