In order to expedite processing of abstracts and publication of the proceedings, the abstracts should adhere to a single format. The abstracts must be typed in Times Roman 12 point font and formatted to fit a single 8.5" x 11" page with 1" margins on all sides. Each paragraph should be indented .30", full justified, and typed with single line spacing. One line space between paragraphs is also required. Small figures and tables may also be included to illustrate the research. You can use this page as a guide. When completed, save the abstract as a file using your (student) name as the file name. The acceptable file formats are: MSWord, WordPerfect, and .PDF. If submitting in MSWord, use the "NORMAL" TEXT STYLE for the entire abstract, including the title/header and references/footnotes.

Abstract files (name: "Abstract-YourLastName-G or -UG") should be emailed as a email attachment to Professor Sanjay Khare at sanjay.khare@utoledo.edu by October 17, 2008. Please put in the email subject header "Symposium Abstract - Your Last Name - G (grad student) or -UG (undergrad student)".

Those selected for presentation will be notified by October 22, and a Schedule of Presentations will be posted by October 24, 2008.

References should be numbered consecutively in order of appearance in the text and placed in parentheses (1) in the text (2,3). For consistency, please follow the AAAS format (check a recent issue of *Science* for guidelines). Abstracts must be no longer than one page.
