Legal Programs, Scholarship, and Contests

The City of Chicago Department of Law is seeking Post-Graduate Fellows for 2019

The City of Chicago Department of Law invites graduating law students to apply for a Post-Grad Fellowship position for 2019. Post-Grad Fellows will participate in challenging work that reflects the demands and rewards of public service, as well as a realistic picture of what it is like to practice law for the City of Chicago. They must have funding in place before they apply.

Post-Grad Fellows receive incomparable hands-on legal experience working side-by-side with Department of Law attorneys. They will be assigned to work in a Law Department practice Division* that interests them and participate in a wide variety of activities. Post-Grad Fellows may:

- assist in trial preparation;
- attend depositions;
- observe real estate closings;
- attend client meetings;
- attend court proceedings;
- conduct legal research and analysis; and

- draft memoranda, briefs, and contracts.

Post-Grad Fellows who qualify for an Illinois Supreme Court Rule 711 License may represent the City in:

- mandatory tort arbitrations in the Circuit Court of Cook County;
- grievance arbitration hearings and disciplinary proceedings before the Police Board and Human Resources Board;
- prosecutions of Municipal Code Violations in Administrative Hearings or in the Circuit Court of Cook County;
- cases before the Circuit Court of Cook County (Criminal, Civil and Chancery Divisions) and Federal Court;
- hearings before the Department of Administrative Hearings and the Department of Business Affairs and Licensing;
- settlement agreement negotiations; and
- real estate closings.

They may also depose or examine witnesses in trials in State and Federal Court.

The Law Department seeks talented, promising individuals from a wide variety of backgrounds. The Law Department is committed to increasing opportunities for minorities in the legal profession, and it is proud that its staff reflects the racial, cultural, and ethnic diversity of Chicago. The Law Department is an Equal Employment Opportunity and Military Friendly Employer.

Please note that Chicago residency is not required for Post-Grad Fellows.

Shumaker, Loop, and Kendrick, LLP Diversity Scholarship

The Shumaker Diversity Scholarship provides a \$7,500.00 scholarship to two (2) outstanding first or second year law students who are enrolled at an ABA accredited law school and who

participate in the firm's summer associate program, to assist in offsetting his or her law school expenses. The scholarship is in addition to the salary paid to the student for his or her Summer Associate position.

The Shumaker Diversity Scholarship is available to students who are members of underrepresented or minority groups. Applicants must have outstanding undergraduate and law school academic credentials, and demonstrated leadership abilities and community involvement. Applicants must also demonstrate a commitment to practice law after graduating from law school in the geographic area of one of our firm's offices.

Eligibility for the Shumaker Diversity Scholarship requires that the recipient participate in and complete the firm's summer associate program following his or her first or second year of law school, for a minimum of eight weeks. Shumaker will select the office in which the student will work, but will attempt to place the student in the office location of his or her choice. The scholarship will be paid upon the student's completion of the firm's summer associate program.

Students who are interested in applying for the Shumaker Diversity Scholarship must submit the following documents:

1. A completed application form, together with a current law school transcript. (contact OPD for application, or see Symplicity)
 2. A current resume, including a description of the applicant's academic and leadership skills, community involvement, and personal and professional accomplishments.
 3. A description of why the student believes that diversity is important and how his or her identified diverse background(s) would contribute to that philosophy.
 4. A legal writing sample.
 5. Letters of recommendation from three academic or professional references.

MIKE EIDSON SCHOLARSHIP

The Mike Eidson Scholarship Fund was established by the AAJ Women for Justice Education Fund in 2008, in honor of AAJ Past President Mike Eidson, whose vision and

generosity inspired it. The Mike Eidson Scholarship awards \$5,000 annually to a female student entering her third year of law school (the student can be enrolled in a three-year day program or four-year night program) who has demonstrated a commitment to a career as a trial lawyer, along with dedication to upholding and defending the principles of the Constitution, and to the concept of a fair trial, the adversary system, and a just result for the injured, the accused, and those whose rights are jeopardized. The winner must attend the 2018 AAJ Annual Convention in Denver, Colorado in order to accept the scholarship. Travel and accommodation will be provided.

2018 CYCLE

The 2018 scholarship cycle is closed. The next cycle will open in February 2019.

Applications must include the following:

Executive Committee for Mindfulness in Law Society Law Student Division

The Mindfulness in Law Society Law Student Division (MILS LSD) is seeking a new Executive Committee to lead its chapters for law students interested in mindfulness, yoga, and other contemplative practices. There are currently 25 chapters at law schools

across the country, and the division continues to grow as law schools recognize the importance of mental health and wellbeing in legal education.

Responsibilities

The Executive Committee is responsible for supporting and networking with existing chapters, helping new chapters form, and helping the national organization serve the law student community. Each board member has specific responsibilities.

The **Chair of the Executive Committee** leads the committee and also sits on the MILS National Board of Directors, contributing a student perspective and providing updates on the LSD on the monthly MILS Board conference calls. Other positions include:

- **Conference and Involvement Director** provides student support for National MILS events.
- **Inter-Chapter Director** coordinates between the Executive Committee and individual chapters.
- **New Chapter Director** works with individual law schools interested in starting chapters.
- **Alternative Spring Break Director** works with the MILS LSD Faculty Advisor and other national MILS Board members to create an Alternative Spring Break Experience for 3L's taking place in Spring 2020, which will feature mindful practices, volunteer experiences, and preparation for a fulfilling legal career.

The total weekly time commitment for the Executive Committee position varies greatly, but one could expect to spend between 1-3 hours a week.

Benefits

You will build relationships with law students from around the country who share a passion for mindfulness, yoga, and other contemplative practices. You will work and network with the lawyers, judges, and law professors from around the country who serve on the MILS Board. You may also be invited to represent the Student Division at national conferences and events (travel expenses provided).

Selection Process

Interested 1Ls or 2Ls currently involved with a MILS-LSD Chapter or interested in forming a MILS LSD Chapter are welcome to apply. **Applications (including a resume and/or CV) must be submitted to the current MILS LSD Chair by 5:00 pm on Monday, March 4, 2019.** Interviews will be conducted to meet with applicants, discuss their strengths, and detail which the position(s) they are interested in, and why. The Executive Committee will be announced on April 10, 2019. The incoming Executive Committee will serve from May 2019 - May 2020.
