Ohio Driver's License Reinstatement Clinic

We are in search of volunteers to help with a series of clinics to help people to reinstate their driver's licenses. The volunteers will meet with the client, look through their suspensions, and determine the best course of action.

Representatives from the BMV will also be there to determine if the person is eligible for a fee waiver or reduction in fees through the new limited Amnesty Program. The volunteer will advise the client, provide them with a plan on next steps, and help them understand the process.

Toledo Municipal Court, the Public Defender's office, LAWO and ABLE, Criminal Justice Coordinating Council, License Intervention Program, and the Toledo Bar Association Pro Bono Program representatives will also be in attendance.

The first clinic will be Monday, April 1 from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the Frederick Douglass Community Center at 1001 Indiana Ave., Toledo, Ohio 43607. Future clinic dates at other locations will be coming soon.

There will be a training/run-through on Monday, March 25 at 1:30 p.m. at the Toledo Bar Association. Volunteers should plan on attending this training, even if you cannot attend the first clinic, but want to volunteer at future clinics. **Volunteers should plan to bring their laptops, if possible.**

Volunteers should have some familiarity with criminal/traffic issues as the training will focus mostly on the BMV amnesty program. We will not be able to provide more in-depth training due to the time restrictions of getting these clinics set up and done before the amnesty program ends.

The Animal Welfare Institute and the National Link Coalition, with the support of the Ohio Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers (NASW Ohio), will be hosting three regional seminars in Cleveland, Toledo, and Columbus to explore this critical issue and opportunities to establish and enhance cross-training and cross-reporting processes at the local level. These seminars will explore "the dark side" of the human-animal bond and its implications for human and humane services, family welfare agencies, prosecutors, law enforcement, and human and veterinary medicine. The seminars will describe new strategies, public policy, research, and programs to prevent family violence and to respond to its human and animal victims.

Topics to be addressed include the following: animal hoarding, animal sexual abuse, animal fighting, applicable statutes and statistics, case studies, and animal abuse's specific links with child maltreatment, domestic violence, elder abuse, and community violence. - hearings before the Department of Administrative Hearings and the Department of Business Affairs and Licensing;
- settlement agreement negotiations; and
- real estate closings.

They may also depose or examine witnesses in trials in State and Federal Court.
