Biographical/Historical Sketch

William Eugene Hollon was born on May 28, 1913, in Commerce, Texas. He earned a B.A. in English from East Texas State Teachers College (1934), an M.A. in Education and History from the University of Texas (1937), and a Ph.D. in American History from the University of Texas (1942). Hollon taught in secondary schools in Texas from 1934 to 1945. During World War II, he was also an instructor in the Navy Pre-Flight School at Kerrville, Texas. In 1945, Hollon joined the Department of History at the University of Oklahoma, where he taught until 1966. For the last sixteen years of that time, he served as the Curator of History at the University's Stovall Museum of Science and History. Hollon joined the department of History at the University of Toledo in 1966, and retired from that post in 1977. In addition to his more traditional teaching activities, Hollon served as a Fulbright lecturer in Peru in 1958, and at the University of Madrid, Spain for the 1966-67 academic year. Dr. Hollon was a visiting professor of history at the University of New Mexico in the summer of 1960, and at the University of Montana in the summer of 1964. He also worked as a Peace Corps instructor in El Salvador and Puerto Rico in 1963 and 1964.

Dr. Hollon wrote several major books, scholarly articles, and shorter articles for encyclopedias in addition to a number of book reviews. His publications include outlines of U.S. history, a history of pre-flight training in the American military, and biographies of the western explorers Zebulon Pike and Randolph Marcy. Among his other works are books on the American Southwest, such as *The Southwest: Old and New, The Great American Desert, Western America, The Texas Journals and Notes of William Bollaert* and *Frontier Violence.*Dr. Hollon received fellowships from the American Philosophical Society, the Rockefeller Foundation, the American Research Institute, the Newberry Library, and the Huntington Library. He was a founder and past president of the Western Historical Association, and a member of the Great Plains Historical Association, the Southwestern Historical Association, and the Arizona Historical Association. He also belonged to eh Ohiop Academy of History and the Organization of American Historians. In 1968, he was named a Regents Professor by the Ohio Board of Regents.

While at the University of Toledo, Dr. Hollon helped establish the doctoral program in History, and served as the foundation for the department's reputation in western history. Dr. Hollon died May 19, 2002 in Gilmer Texas.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of the papers of W. Eugene Hollon, a leading scholar on the history of the American West. The collection should prove especially useful for the study of the history of the West from Spanish colonization up to the present, as well as historiography and Dr. Hollon's career.

The collection is arranged by topic into three series: Series I- Personal and Professional Correspondence; Series II- Manuscripts and Research Materials; and Series III- Photographs. The collection occupies 24 linear feet.

Series I is arranged chronologically and alphabetically by correspondent, reader, or organization. Noted correspondence includes letters from Carl Coke Rister, Paul Angle, Ray Billington, and Alfred Knopf. The series dates from 1945-1993. A book of letters from former students and colleagues presented to Dr. Hollon at his retirement from UT is filed within the series.

Series II documents Hollon's major research and publishing interests during his career. Manuscritpts and proofs of several of Hollon's books form a large part of the series, including *The Southwest: Old and New, The Great American Desert, Western America, The Texas Journals and Notes of William Bollaert* and *Frontier Violence*. The series also includes miscellaneous items such as Hollon's vitae.

Series III contains photographs associated with Hollon's research. Researchers should note that the photographs may be governed by copyrights from the original sources.
